In y^e name of God almon, I James Barn being sick & weak of body but in effect -
memory & mind of God, doe indigne & make this my Will in manner & form as
followeth, first I commit my soul to y^e Almighty God who gave it me, and for
my worldly goods I give as followeth,

I give unto my sonnes James Barn the one halfe of my plantation I now live on
beginning at y^e great rocke running to y^e Barre, from thence by y^e land beyond this
part being y^e Land I now live on, I give to my sonnes Arthur Barn, I give that
part of my Land that part of my Land that Henry Balles now liveth on, to him
& his Heires for ever lawfully begotten of their bodies, next I give unto my sonnes
George Barn, four hundred acres of Land lying on the Brandydamme Swamp, it being
part of a patteon purchased by Wm Evans & my selfe of Matthew Birchall, for
all such Lands I give unto my sonnes & their Heires for ever lawfully begotten
and in case of death in both a one of my sonnes, y^e Land shall be equally divided
both above & below, and all my sonnes shalbe dye without having issue of their
owne bodies, I give unto my four daughters, Mary, Rose, Joane & Anne all the
above said Land to them & their Heires lawfully begotten for ever, And in case any
one of them die before her to returne to y^e Surveyor or Surveyors of any of my daughters

As to my rest of my Estates, I give & bequeath as followeth, I give & bequeath to my loving wife Jane Barn, the sum 3000 £ furniture that belongs to her, also all given her my Chest & Boxes for use of my plantation, also there is of Bedds due to Mary Kinge out of my Estates, for w^e bedding desire is that she shall have my second best Bedd & Bedding one sheet one p^r Blanketts one Rugg & Bedding Clo^d, also doo give unto her aforesaid Mary Kinge these Quets to be delivered to her this next Spring, also for my rest of my Estates after my just debts and p^r my desire is that it shall be equally divided between my wife and Children, only my Chest & furniture the profits & produce of it, to be employed to providing of my four small Children, now att^r the age of my Wife Jane Barn, shew to return to my first sonne James deffence George, I do make my loving wife Jane Barn my childe & sole ex^r of f^r my last will & Testament, I also request Mr John Byles, Mr George Smyth & James Fullaloy to be executors of this my Will, Given under my hand & seal in^r presence of us, this 6th of February 1696 and further affter my wife Jane Barns dooing my Will is that my sonne James Barn have a plantation, witness my hand and seal this day & year above written, the plantation is it that James live on for my Wifes life
