 I appoint say^d Cap^t Randolph my sole Executor

In the name of God Amen, I James Brown being sick & weak of body but in full
 memory praise God, do hereby make this my Will in manner & form as
 followeth, first I commit my soul to y^e Almighty God who hath given it me, And for
 my worldly goods I give as followeth,

I give unto my Sonne James Brown the one halfe of my plantation I now live on
 beginning att y^e great creek set running to y^e Bars, from thence to y^e head Lynes, this
 part being Land I now live on, I give to my Sonne Stephen Brown, I give that
 part of my Land that part of my Land that Henry Bales now live on, to them
 & their Heires for ever lawfully begotten of their Bodies, Next I give unto my Sonne
 George Brown, four hundred acres of Land lying on the Beaver damme Swamp, it being
 part of a patent purchased by Wm Evans & my selfe of Matthew Shirckland, for
 all such Lands I give unto my Sonne & their Heires for ever being lawfully begotten
 and in case of defect in both a one of my Sonne, y^e Land shall be equally divided
 both above & below, And all my Sonne should dye without having Issue of their
 own Bodies, I give unto my four daughters, Mary, Sara, Joane & Abigail all the
 aforesaid Land to them & their Heires lawfully begotten for ever, And in case of
 defect of Issue it is to returne to y^e Survivour or Survivors of any of my Daughters

As to the rest of my Estate, I give & bequeath as followeth, I give & bequeath to my
 Loving wife Jane Bourn, the best Bedd & Furniture that belongs to George, also I
 give her my Curt & Carpet for use of my plantation, also there is a Bedd due to Mary Knight
 out of my Estate, for w^{ch} bedding desire is that she shall have my second best Bedd & Bedstee
 One sheet one p^r Blanketts one kugg Bedstead & Cord, I also doe give unto my aforesaid
 Mary Knight these Ewes to be delivered to her this next Spring, And for the rest of my Estate
 after my Just debts and p^r my desire is that it shall be equally divided between my wife and
 Children, only my Skill & Furniture the profits & produce of it, to be employed to y^e Training
 of my four small Children, And all y^e debts of my wife Jane Bourn, shall be returned to my
 three sons, James Arthur & George, I do make my loving wife Jane Bourn my sole
 & sole Ex^{ec} of this my last will & Testament, I also request, Mr John Gyles, Mr George
 Smyth & James Fullage to be Overseers of this my Will, Given under my hand & seal
 in y^e presence of us, this 6th of February 1696 And further after my wife Jane Bourns
 desire my will is that my ^{son} Janets Bourn having plantation, Witnes my hand and
 seal y^e day & year above written, the plantation is it that Jane live on for my wifes
 life
