general day of resurection shall rise again with joy through the mercies of Christ & the

of Baron to my daughter Black two fletches of Baron: my sonne Wilson to haue the first
choice I do give unto John Brown abreding how my new Cloth breeches I do give
unto my sonne Wilson what new paulyes there be I do give betwix my sonne Wilson and
my sonne James my deale lif with all my Cooldes Savors Stooles apes and other lumber
nominating Christopher and Appoynting my londing friends and neighboris witness
Exeuctor of this my last will and testament requesting him to see the same
duly performed in Willm the 11th of March next unto putting my hand and seal the day by
yestern even written James Sampson to his last Will and Testament in presence of 3
