in manner and form following first Comended my Soule to the hands of god my maker hoping
eternally through the only merit of Jesus Christ my Saviour to be made partaker of life
everlasting and Comended my body to other hands wherof it is made as for all and singular
the Lands and Estates that w^tre a greate Consideration of my former husband Francis England
to be at my disposing and such goods and chattels that I have heretofore disposed of
before marriage with my now husband I do give & bequeath unto my selfe & herewith followeth first
I do give and bequeath unto my loving husband George Cripps the heire and plantation which
on me to now lie together with all and singular the Land byngt thence a French Cell Land
known by the name of Parc de Brans and a little of Ervy known by the name of
Henry Kinges line to be and remain to him and his Heires for Estate, as for all the rest land
and Lieue of my Land I do give and bequeath unto my brother Son of my former husband
England that shall come into this Country and make Clamrie to the same within four
yeare after my decease to be and remain to him and his Heires for Estate, and if
none such doth within the said yeare make Clamrie to the said Land then it is my
will that my now husband shall have the same to him and his Heires for Estate, and it is
my will that my husband shall possesse all the Land & Entail such to my brother Son of my
husband England doth within the time abovesayd come to claim the same
I do give and bequeath unto my Sister Elizabeth one thousand pounds of Tobacco or
other things off that Belte to my husband and she can agree to be paid within one
yeare after my decease I do likewise give unto my Sister Elizabeth fifty acres of Land that
doth by me entall to that Plantation whereon the said now lies during his naturall life
~~and after his death~~ It is my will after my decease Nicholas Davis shall may that Plantation wherein
he now lieth during his naturall life without paying of Rent only a Capone therefor
and next after his death I do give unto Sarah upolast her husband and her son Rugg Blunt
and Blunt half a dozen of Chickens Chayres and a Round Table I do give unto Mr. George
Francis Esq^r (Sir) Francis son and his wife each of them a Cow of about 4 years
old It is my will that that Orphant boy that now lieth with me & name Anthony Lewis
to lie with my husband until he attain to the age of one and twenty years if my
husband and he shall live so long that my husband give him two suits of apparel
One Barrell of Corn One Peirce with Calves One Couch Bed a small gowne & One Pinte
list In Dray and One Spoon if it shall so happen my husband should die before
the boy attains to the age of one and twenty years then it is my will that the
above named things shall be delivered to the s^r Anthony Lewis I do give unto Margaret
the wife of Peter Dyer a suit of my weareing apparel and my Wedding Ring
I do give unto Thos and Bradwell my Sisters Daughters One Shilling of English money
I do give unto my three good Daughters (viz) Elizab. & Mary Dyer & Bessie and
Joyce Wark Each of them one £ of Holland of about Sixty p^s. I do give unto
my 3 god Sons (viz) James Dyer & Nicholas Davis and William Phillips Each
of them a Cow Calf that is weanable I do give unto my mother Blakes a gold
Ring with a stone in it I do constitute nominate and appoint my selfe
to be my husband & exec^r of this my last Will and Testament In witness

Exempted such as Payll and Custole equally divided betwix me and my wife —
Elizabeth and my two Sons Thomas and William also it is my desir that if there do
arise any just discorde betwix me my wife and my two Sons that then they may have Entry
thing of what doth belong to the said goods and Cattell and to have the full libertie to chuse
their Gardiners save only it is my desir that if either of my Sons or both haue the
desir to chuse their Gardiners it is my desir that they may not chuse any of their kindest
or Relation what so ever and I do Commande and Urge Elizabeth my loving wif to my hold and
sole execution of this my last Will and Testam: In witness herof I have hereunto set my
