I, George the wife of George Cripps being sick of Body but of good and perfect memory do make and contain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following first I Comend my Soule to the hands of god my maker hoping assuredly through the only merits of Iesus Christ my Saviour, to be made partaker of life Everlasting and I Comend my body to the earths wherof it is made as for all and singular the Lands and Etnm. that were given unto me by my former husband Francis England to be at my disposing and such goods and Chattels that shold be at my free disposing after my death with my now husband, I do give, bequeath and dispose of as follows the first I do give and bequeath unto my loving husband George Cripps the house and plantation wher on we do now live together with all and singular the Land lying thereunto a Branch Call'd and known by the name of Parrots Branch and a line of Etnm known by the name of Henry Kings line to be and remain to him and his Heirs for Ever, as for all the rest and residue of my Land, I do give and bequeath unto my Brother's son of my former husband Englands that shall come into this Country and make Claim to the same within such year as after my decease to be and remain to him and his Heirs for Ever, and if none such doth within the said year make Claim to the said Lands then it is my will that my now husband shall have the same to him and his Heirs for Ever, and it is my will that my husband shall possess all the Land until such time as my Brother's son of my husband Englands doth within the time at me limited come to Claim the same. I do give and bequeath unto my Sister Thomas one Cload and pounds of Tobacco or other things of that Value as my husband and she can agree to be paid within one year after my decease. I do likewise give unto my Sister Thomas fifty Acres of Land that doth joyn to that Plantation wher on she doth now live during her Natural life. ~~and it is my will~~ It is my will after my decease Nicholas Davis shall have that Plantation wher on he now liveth during his Natural life without paying of Rent only a Capon a year for a cock and nest of eggs. I do give unto Sarah Cupola's father's bed and Chamber One Rugg Blanket and Bedstead half a dozen of Leather Chayres and a Round Table I do give unto Mr. George Francis's three Children (viz) Francis John and Ann each of them a Cow of a good sort. It is my will that that Orphant Boy that now liveth with me by name Anthony Lewis to live with my husband until he attains to the Age of one and twenty years if my husband and he shall live so long that my husband give him two suits of apparell, One Barrell of Corn One Hofer with Calves One Couch bed a small Iron Pot One Basket One Tray and One Spoon if it shall so happen my husband should die before the Boy doth attain to the Age of one and twenty years then it is my will that the above named things shall be delivered to the said Anthony Lewis, I do give unto Margaret the wife of Peter Dapier a Suite of my wearing apparell and my Wedding Ring. I do give unto Thos. an. Braswell my Sister's Daught the best Shilling of English money. I do give unto my three God Daughters (viz) Elizabeth Mary Joyce Butler and Joyce Monck each of them One Ell of Holland of a good sort of p. Ell. I do give unto my 3 God Sons (viz) James Bonnet Nicholas Davis and William Phillips each of them a Cow Calfe that is weanable. I do give unto my Mother's Sister a gold Ring with a Blue Stone in it. The Constitutⁿ nominates and appoints myself the last husband Exec^r of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness

 tion to Eternall life through the only merit and Satisfaction of Jesus Christ
 my only Saviour and Redeemer
 I Give and Bequeath unto my Dear and Loving wife Elizabeth and my two Sons Thomas
 and William all my worldly goods which it hath pleased God to Endue me withall and
 to be paid due to me from any person or persons whatsoever they be and faithfully
 paying all my Debts above it is my desire that then my Estate shewable and summeable
 Excepted unto such as Payable and Cutable Equally divided between my wife
 Elizabeth and my two Sons Thomas and William, above it is my desire that if there do
 arise any just discord between my wife and my two Sons that then they may have Entry
 thing of what doth belong to the said goods and Cattle, and to have the Liberty to Chuse
 their several Shares only if it is my desire that if either of my Sons or both have the
 Occasion to Chuse their Share it is my desire that they may not Chuse any of their kindred
 or Relation whatsoever and I do constitute and Ordaine Elizabeth my loving wife my whole and
 sole Executrick of this my last Will and Testament: In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and sealed this Day and Year above Writing
