In witness whereof I give & bequeath my soule unto the Almighty God that gaus it hoping by his mercie
of my saule I Iesus Christ to obtaine the forgiveness of my sinnes & eternall salvation my
body I bequeath unto the earth to be buried in a Christianlike manner and for my temporall
estate I give and bequeath as followeth /

Item I give & bequeath unto my Brother Edmund one thousand pound of to be paid at
the Exchequer that shall be in the year of our lord God 1670

I give & bequeath to my sister, Elme ffendyners, one black & white hysse fower years old
somewhat neare a calf by her side & one three years old hysse Bull and black /

I give & bequeath unto Richard Smootum one year of his time, of servitude bound by indenture

I give & bequeath unto Mary Wp: daughter of Thomas Wp: one cow calfe /

I give & bequeath unto William ffryll the sonne of William ffryll one cow calfe /

And for the rest of my Estate, I give unto my wellbelovd wife Elme ffendyners, whom I
make & ordaine my whole & sole executrix in wylles & wherof, I have hereto unto sett my hand
& seal this thirteenth day of March 1668 /

to be my executor of all my whole estate, both here & in England, and I do desire him, to sell my land in
Northampton shire, and after he hath sold him self the charges he is & shall owe, the same
to divide amongst my Brethren & Sisters /
