Creator in Jesus and Certain's hope of Salvation through the merits of my Jesus
Saviour Jesus Christ, and my body to the earth to be buried at the discretion
of my loving wife

I give and bequeath unto my Son Martha Jennings all the remainder of the whole
tract and the land of it and w^{ch} I now live on, w^{ch} all Rivers Orchards Gardens Straws
appurtenances whatsoever, the rents belonging, and also one parcel of Land w^{ch} I have
now live on containing by Survey nine Acres of Land to him my said Son
for ever, and the River of his Body lawfully begotten, but if it shall please God
to take my said Son out of this mortal life without issue that then it is my
will that my said Land & goods to my s^r Son bequeath to the survivor of my
Daughters her name is, then I give unto my s^r Son, One Silver Cankard
w^{ch} holds about a pebble and one Silver Salt-Seller half a dozen of ²⁴ Silver spoons &
one Silver Cup marked I M one Small Dram Cupp and one Small Sack Cupp marked
I E. I then give unto my said Son one Mullatow Boy and one Dutch Christ and one
Waggon seat Cress and two smaller beds with Darnix Curtains and Ballance with
Rugge Blankets and three Shruballs to the w^{ch} to the w^{ch} and Pillows
I then give to my Son Martha and all my Arm w^{ch} I have Except the things after
named then I give to my s^r Son one pair of Land w^{ch} is with Cress to go with
Conquest and Silver Shoffill trap

I then give unto my two Daughters Mary Jennings and Martha Jennings during their Natural
lives all my whole Estate and Incident of Land on Lyons Creek containing two hundred and
fifty Acres of high land and one hundred of Marsh to be Equally divided between them
wholly to be theirs to the Age of Twenty years or thereabouts

I then give unto my Daughter Mary Jennings One Cordiall Cupp marked I I and One Silver
Cankard marked II and half a dozen of Silver spoons marked I M and One Silver
Salt-Seller marked II and One Silver Sugar Dish marked II and One pair of Small Irons
with Brass Conquest and Silver Shoffill, I then give unto my said Daughter Mary Jennings
Pearls and One Father Bed with Bolster two Pillows a pair of Sheets Blankets and
Rugge with Curtains and Ballance of Darnix

I then give unto my Daughter Martha Jennings One Silver Christ marked I M and One Silver
Cankard marked I I and half a dozen of spoons marked I M One Silver Cankard about
a quart marked I I I then give unto my said Daughter One Mare and One Father bed
with Bolster two Pillows Rug Blankets and Shoffill

I then give unto my Daughter Sarah Jennings fifty Acres of Land which formerly bought of Belcher
with Addition of a small parcel of land in the fifty Acres and the great Ballance coming to
my house and so to her part with all her w^{ch} Orchard Gardens and profits belonging
I then give unto my s^r Daughter Sarah half a dozen of Silver spoons not mark One Silver
Sugar Dish marked I I and One Silver Cankard marked I M and One plain Lead Cupp I then
give unto my said Daughter One Mare and One Father bed with Bolster pillow Rugge Blanket

And this with Cartons & Ballons of Darnix and One Gong mare
I then give unto my Son in law w^{ch} I now live on a large and Belt w^{ch} was formerly his Father's
I then give unto George Howard One Small Sack Silver Cupp with a footstool to it and one brass of silver

I then give unto my loving wife Mary Jennings half a dozen of Silver spoons marked
I then I wish that my said Son and three Daughters do enjoy their lands when they come to the
Age of Twenty years or thereabouts

It is my Will, that for the remainder of my Estate I have being wife Mary-
Jennings whom I do make my full and sole executrix of this my last Will to
be divided by the said wife and Overseers hereafter named between her and
my said four Children, and further I do request my loving friends and also
appoint them viz: Cap: Edmund Wickham, George Moore, James Brown and
William Edward to be my Executors of this my last Will and Testament to be
performed I do revoke all former Wills I have hereto made my husband and
Wife this 19th of October in the Year of our Lord 1678 that is to say
and bequeath my whole library of books to my sons and Daughters my Gold Ring
and Silver Plate also I do give my Will that Every one of my Executors shall have
10s to be them a Ring

Jennings of the County of Wight being wife of the late John Jennings of the said
County of Wight deceased and having last made my last Will
and Testament and therein bequeathed my land and moveables amongst my
Children according as it is therein further Expressed and finding that therein I omitted
and did not fully declare my desires Concerning the Welfare and truly settling
my plantation now lying open and out of a bond to care and Consideration of the
Welfare and prosperity of my said wife and Children after my decease do here by
declare Order and desire that what Debts are due to me by my loving wife
received, as soon as may or possible can be paid and bring to her Receipt to be disposed
of by my said wife and that her discretion managed to pay my Debts and furnish my
plantation with servants and other necessaries for the comfortable support of
my wife and Children, and to pay to the Orphans of Mr. William Edward dec'd. their
Wages that I am indebted unto them, and if my said Wife by Bills Bonds
or Decies shall not be found sufficient to pay my said loving wife to accomplish this my
desires and Order herein Express'd, according to the true intent meaning and desire
hereof, then I do hereby authorize Order and request my said loving wife to sell and
dispose of so much of my personal Estate as she shall find sufficient to perform
and accomplish my Order and Order herein Express'd without being liable to
my living Executors or Administrators anything touching in my said last Will
Testament to the contrary of this my Order notwithstanding, this being by me declared
to be my Order and desire in the presence of Mr. Nicholas Smith, Thomas Carter
and other witnesses this 10th Day of 3rd 1678 and then confirmed with my hand and
Seal in the presence of the persons above Express'd
