two yonkers one cleane shafe and one blacke Boar a braftable about them gallons and out of the long swampe
and two of the long swampe doth two plantees recommended and two plantees a matching fowen and the like
and dooth of sevonty and all the land thereto warr about the house & curwering, for a yarde standard and
shimes, first kinde of young hoggis, and all the meat that is about the house, and I give unto my wife a braftle
spine hockes and my hoggs meat and also hogg glasse and all the glasse belte in the house.

I give and bequeath unto my sonne humphrey my hechthe with all his furniture to it, one rounde Cupboard
and one large Iron board, Chife and one large Iron pott a dressing pan, and one from Spitt, five hechthes yng
logg'd about them, a quarell of ayent wuld a yonge hiefe of two yeare old female on yowred dish and
scutched Dishes etc and also a wooden shewre

In the evening wrote my daughter Mary several news notes and two new plates on large box and one
quart flagon two porringers and a number of bread bowls on iron pot of about 1 bushel Gallons likewise
gave to my daughter one cow about five or six years old and a heifer about two years old and
five head of young hogs of both quarters of a year old.

John Marshall being in perfect memory here mistaken concerning his land that I gave unto my wife
Jems. But it knowes that if my sonne Humphrey die before he comes to age that then what I give unto my
sonne Humphrey shall be my youngfife sonnes and if it shal please god to take them both to his mercie
After he cometh to age that then all that I have given unto my sonnes, it is my will that my louing wife
and daugther Mary shall have it between them to appoint my louing Brotheres Humphrey Marshall
and Peter Shiff to be my executors of this my last will and Testament and to take care that my children
be brought up in the fear of god and taught in the Bible and other books for the true informed
of this my last will and Testament I have hereunto sett my hand and sealed this present fourth day of
October, 1657.

Item I owe quire and Bequath to me my lording of Elizabeth Moore my plantation wherion now but late
when two hundred acres of land he have and he shuld during his natural life and then to return to me

to the said plantation to him and his heirs for ever
Item I do give and bequeath to my sonne Thomas Moore and my daughter Elizabeth Moore and my daughter
Anne Moore, each of them one hundred acres of land joining to Thomas parrells land to them and their
heirs for ever as for my mount all that I have I wholely be my louing wife Elizabeth Moore and her
disposessing whom god appointe who will and sole executrix of this my self will and diffirent in writing
written at the moore plantation have hereunto set my hand this day and year about written
in the month of March in the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred and sixty eight John Moore I M. witness
