

In the name of God Amen

I John Marshall being sick in body but in perfect memory I give this my last Will and Testament in manner following

First I give and bequeath my soule to God what part it will and give I committ my body to the earth from whence it came to be buried in such decent manner as my wife shall thinke fitt and for my worldly goods after my debts being truly paid I dispose as followeth

First I give and bequeath unto my sonne Humphrey the plantation that I am now possesse with all riving & public long swamps next to the river of the youngst some all the land that hath beene long since of the longe Swamp of the river to come to age, And likewise I give unto my loving wife Elizabeth the Bedd that she hath upon and all the furniture that she hath long since had, one Cow and a youngste about two yeeres old, one blacke sheepe and one blacke Boxe a brasse kettle about seven Gallons and one of the best of heres and two of the best of puerles dishes two puerles porringers and two plates a smelting Iron and three Forks and a dox of spoone and all the rattle in water about the house a warming pan a pair of tuckard and skinner, five head of young hogg, and all the wares that is about the house, and I give unto my wife a brasse spire mortar and a warming pan and a looking glass and all the glass bottles in the house

I give and bequeath unto my sonne Humphrey one feather Bedd and all the furniture to it, one Court Cupbord and one large Iron bound Chest and one large Iron pot, a warming pan, and one Iron spit, five head of young hogg: about three quarters of a yeere old a youngste of two yeere old female on puerles dish and puerles dishes and a large wooden plaine

I bequeath unto my daughter Mary five new puerles dishes and two new plates on large box and one quart peger two porringers and a puerles bowl on Iron pot of about three Gallons like wise I give unto my daughter one Cow about five or six yeeres old and a kettle about two yeeres old and five head of young hogg & three quarters of a yeere old

I give and bequeath to my youngste sonne John the Bedd I give unto my youngste sonne one hundred and twenty pounds of tobacco and three puerles dishes and two plates two porringers and an Iron spit one Iron pot of three Gallons one wooden Chest one Cow of six yeeres old and a kettle about two yeeres old and five head of young hogg about three quarters of a yeere old when he come of age if he live so long

I John Marshall being in perfect memory have mistaken concerning the land that I gave unto my two sonne: It is knowne that if my sonne Humphrey die before he come to age that then what I give unto my sonne Humphrey it shall be my youngste sonne and if it should please god to take them both to his mercie before they come to age that then all that I have given unto my sonne, it is my Will that my loving wife and daughter Mary shall have it to be used as they shall see my loving Brother Humphrey Marshall and shee shall be to be my ovedors of this my last Will and Testament and to take care that my children be brought up in the feare of god and to read in the bible and other booke for the true performance of this my last Will and Testament I have here unto seth my hand and said this present fourth day of october 1687

In the name of God gracious and mercifull I John Moore of the lower part of the County of Wright being sick in body but in perfect memory I give this my last Will and Testament in manner following First and principally I commit my soule into the hands of almighty god my maker & steadfastly believing that I shall receive his pardon for all my sins and be saved through the precious death and merit of my sauiour & Redeemer I Christ Jesus and my body to the earth with Christian buriall after any other worldly goods or estate which the Lord hath bene pleased to send unto me I give and bequeath as here after followeth

First I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Elizabeth Moore my plantation which I now live in and some two hundred acres of land to have and to hold during her natural life and then to returne to my eldest sonne John Moore and to remaine his and his heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto my sonne William Moore two hundred acres of Woodland ground adjoining to the forsaide plantation to him and his heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my sonne Thomas Moore and my daughter Elizabeth Moore and my daughter Ann Moore, each of them one hundred acres of land adjoining to the forsaide plantation to Elizabeth Moore and to her heirs for ever: as for my movable estate I leave it wholly to my loving wife Elizabeth Moore and to her disposing. Whome God appoint whole and sole Exors &c of this my last Will and Testament in writing witness of John Moore the testator have hereunto seth my hand this day and yeere above written
