Reynolds beinge sick and weak in body, yet in perfect memory thanks be to God doe make
this my last will & testament in manner & forme followinge, That is to say first I becom
my soule and spirit into the hands of almighty God, my heavenly Father by whom
of his mercie and only grace, I hope to be saved, & redeemed into eternall rest my body
in hope of a joyfull resurrection, I comitt to the earth to be buried in such place as my
Deare Brothers shall thinke good as touching the Distribution of my Mortall goods I dispose
of the same as followeth / First I will that all my debts be truly paid, I will that my
Brother George Quire, haue one blacke steere & my yellowish steere, about three yeeres old
I will to my Brother Richard Reynolds, one blacke & white pinto steere, & one browne steere
about five yeeres old and a browne bull, wth a meale Mouth about foure yeeres old, And my
land, chnd one sowe runninge att m: Drainers, I will to my Sister Jane Reynolds one blacke
sowe named Ninny chnd two yeerlinge calves /
I will to my Sister Elizabeth Quire, two Cowes named blacke & woodier, and two heifers named
Niger & Venus, one sowe, five piggs, and three shoates
I will Robert Driscoll a browne steere, of two yeeres old & a yeerlinge calf /
I will to Elizabeth Quire her Daughter Mary, five Cowes, one meale Mouth, Golly, Farr & Nimm
and one that runns amongst wth William Bodys cattell chnd three calves and what trimen
I haue and one w: d, coultter & Lunge, wth I ly: rypon, chnd her mother, Elizabeth to haue the
said cattell till the said Mary be huius yeeres of age, or att the day of Marriage /
I will to my Sister Elizabeth Jordan, a bill of Robert Gollards for eight hundred poundes of tobacco
& after the decess to her sonne Richard Jordan /
I will that my Brother Richard Reynolds be: executed in what household goods I haue any
an yron pott, one pewter dish, & three spoones wth I give to my Sister Elizabeth Quire, huius
to receive all debts due to me the said John Reynolds chnd to pay what debts I owe to any
person or persons, chnd what cattell hoggs, or any other goods I haue besides what is willed after
my debts is paid, I give to my Brother Richard Reynolds, trauninge my soule to the hushion
of almighty god, doe witness my hand & seale, the day & yeere aboue written /
