I John Shepherd of the upper parish of the City of Wight County being in health of body and of  
good memory knowing the shortness of death and the uncertainty of life do appoint and order this to be  
my last Will and testament in manner and form following without any of the Courts of the said County  
to have any power to add to or diminish of any of my estate Except the said Court of the said County  
the said Will to be made and if in the last of his last will and testament to be distributed by him in the last hour of it and an  
Item I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Elizabeth Shepherd all my estate personal and real by law  
during her widowhood and if she die in her widowhood that then my son William Shepherd and my daughter  
the said Elizabeth Shepherd to have each of them one third of the said estate Item and if my said wife do die Mary that  
then all the said estate to be equally divided each of them to have a third and that notwithstanding of this my Will  
to be after the said Elizabeth's death and to be so it and improve it as they shall think fit until they come to  
the said Elizabeth's death then the said Elizabeth to enjoy the said estate if either of the said Elizabeth do die before the age of twenty  
one years that then the said Elizabeth to enjoy both parts and if both do die before the age of twenty one years  
that then my son and daughter two of the thirds of the said estate that was the said Elizabeth's to my brother Edward  
Holloway and his children and the other third of my said estate and bequeathed to my cousin Fortune Maggot  
Item I do give and bequeath unto my son William Shepherd to the age of twenty one years
