 my two children: my wife and my own: and to bring them up with my estate to the end of my life: and if
 shall please god that my son John Bond should die without issue then all my estate and my lands all that I Call mine I give and
 and William Manyard with out issue: then all my estate and my lands all that I Call mine I give and
 John Bell my Executor and his heirs for ever: and it is my will that John Farmer should continue
 my house with my two children: with my Executor so long as he shall see fitting: this being my last
 Will and testament as Witness my hand and Seal this 15th day of february 1687

I Thomas Wombwell being in my perfect Senses and Memory do make this my last Will and testament as for my personal estate what I do leave hath bin & is as follows to witte
Item I doe give and bequeath unto my Sonne Thomas three hundred and fifty acres of land with all the new built and old piers ditches and two Courts to him and the heirs of him and his heirs for ever
Item I doe give and bequeath unto my Sonne John three hundred & 40 acres of land at further End of Patient and two piers ditches and two Courts and a younger Mann of a giant wille to him and the heirs of him & his heirs for ever
Item I doe give and bequeath unto my daughter Joyce one feather bed & a bolster and sheets and four or five piers ditches and two Courts and a brasse kettle of eight Gallons one rusia leather Chain on brasse Caudle to her and the heirs of her
Item I doe give unto my daughter Margaret one feather bed & a bolster and sheets and four or five piers ditches and two Courts and a brasse kettle of eight Gallons and a brasse Caudle to her and the heirs of her
Item I doe give and bequeath unto my loving wife Elizabeth the remanent of my personal estate and do make her my whole and sole executrix to have it at her disposing
It is further more my Will that my Sonne Thomas when he is at the age of thirtene years or thereabouts shall have the liberty to take upon his land liberties that my Sonne John shall have the liberty to take at the same age & have the benefit of their own labor and the rest of their estates here before mentioned to be to my joy and my two daughters Joyce and Margaret to have their portions at the day of marriage and to have my two sons brought up to read and to write and the daughters to read and for appoint my two loving friends Thomas Calver and John Murray as my overseers to see this my last Will and testament performed as will assist my hands and to alter this 30th day of March 1687

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Elizabeth Shephard all my Estate personal and real by Real and personal, which she shall have and if she die in her widowhood: that then my son William Shephard and my daughter Barbara Shephard to have each of them one third of the Estate: And if my said wife do die before that then all the Estate to be equally divided each of them to have a third: and that notwithstanding of this my Will to sit after the said parts and to trust it, and improve it: as they shall think fittest until they come to a time that is not lawful to enjoy it then they, I give if either of the said children die before the age of twenty one years that then the other child to enjoy both parts: and if both die before the age of twenty one years that then I give and bequeath two of the thirds of the Estate that was the third due to my brother Edward, to my daughter Mary and my son John and the child I give and bequeath to my Cousin Horatio Maggitt Holloway and his children and the child I give and bequeath to my Cousin Horatio Maggitt
