

In the Name of God Amen, I John Durbilly, of the shire of Wright County being in sound mind and perfect memory, do make this my last will & testament. I first bequeath my soule to God Almighty that gave it, my body to the earth, to be buried in Christian like manner, when it shall please God, to call me out of this world, and for my worldly goods & state, I bequeath in manner & forms as followeth

I give unto my sonne John, the one halfe of the land, I thus gyven after my decease, and the other halfe after the decease, of Ann my wife, wth all houses & buildyngs, that shall then be gyven it, wth all o^r profits, and I bequeath unto my sonne Thomas, two hundred acres of land, out of a parcell of land I purchased of

John Anthony Fulgham & bequeath upon the land of William Godwins, one hundred acres

I give & bequeath unto my sonne William two hundred acres of land, out of the aforesaid parcell of land purchased of the aforesaid Fulgham, & taken out of that part, of the land, that joyneth on my William Godwins land and one hundred acres

I give & bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth one flock of sheep & eight hundred hens, one hamster, one new pair of shoes, & one hundred shillings, one great pentre & latter

Do my sonne in law, John Williams, I give one shilling

Do my grand child, Ann Williams, the daughter of John Williams, I give & bequeath, one lardge pentre & latter, and one hoffer of two yeares of age

And it is my will, that if any of my thress sonnes, shall die, before they come to possess & enjoy the land before bequeath & given, or dy: without issue, that then the said land, to be equally divided between the survivors of my sonnes, & their heirs. And for the rest of my estate, that I shall possess, all the time of my day, I bequeath unto my wellbelovd wife Ann Durbilly, to whom I make my whole & sole executrix. To all Christian people, to whom it may or shall come, I John Durbilly the father of John Durbilly of the shire of Wright County planter deceased, out of tender affection, I have unto my children in this last gift hereafter mentioned, & for other good considerations, best known to me self, do give & bequeath after my decease as followeth

I give unto my eldest sonne John one thousand pounds of tob^l: & to my second sonne Thomas two thousand pounds of tob^l: And to my daughter Elizabeth two thousand pounds of tob^l: & to my sonne William two thousand pounds of tob^l: And my grand child Elizabeth Williams, the daughter of John Williams, one thousand pounds of tob^l: Do with this gift, I have hereunto sett my hand & seale, this thirteenth day of February 1671
