 in manner and forme followinge. That is to say, first I bequeath my soule and spirit into the hands of
 almighty Gods mercifully father, by whom of his mercy and only grace I hope to be saved and brought
 into eternal life my body in hope of a joyfull resurrection commit to the earth to be buried with such
 shalldg: and in such place as my deare wife shall thinke good as touching the distribution of my mortall
 goods I dispose of the same as followeth

I give I will that all my debts be truly paid
 I do give unto my son Thomas a mart: called Drimys: and the sixth part of my Cattle I do give
 unto my daughter Elizabeth, one shillings with the sixth part of my Cattle and six pence
 a booke the rugg: I do give unto my son: John a young horse goinge on of thre year's ould
 and a sixth part of my Cattle. I do give unto my two daughters Anne and Sarah; a mart called
 Bomy to be divided betwixt them and each of them a sixth part of my Cattle and a pence dish
 I do give unto Charles Durham a thre year ould horse
 I do give and bequeath unto my deare wife all the rest of my household goods and my young horse
 and a young horse of a year ould; and the sixth part of my Cattle and all my stocke of hoggs; and
 I do make my deare and lovinge wife her executor of all the rest of my mortall goods movable
 and immovable; and for her my deare wife to chuse what person or persons she shall thinke fitt or
 convenient to offit her, to see my Will perfoxmed, as I will give my hands and seal the day and yeare
 first above writen.

I Hopkin Howell beinge very sick and weak but in perfect sense and memory do make this my
 last Will and Testament first I give my soule to God and my body to be decently buried
 I give and bequeath unto my wife Mary the whole and singular the land which now is
 for her life and after her decease I give unto my son Hopkin all the land from a swamp called by the
 name of the holy bush swamp or was by part of the said land beinge formerly my brother Thomas
 which said land I give unto my son Hopkin and his heirs for ever, as also I give unto my son Hopkin
 my gun: as also I give unto my daughter Mary the rest of the land from the said swamp down
 wards beinge the plantation which I now live on: to her and her heirs for ever and in last
 either of the said children should dye without heirs: then the other to possess the land and in
 last they both dye without heirs: then to my wife and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body
 for ever: and for want of such heirs my Will is that my brother Thomas should have
 shall have the upper part of my land which is before mentioned to him and his heirs for ever
 and the lower part of the land unto John Hale, Junr and his heirs for ever: I do give unto
 John Howell one two year ould horse to be delivered unto him in the yeare of our Lord 1689
 the rest of my estate I do give unto my wife and two children to be equally divided betwixt them
 as also I do make my wife my whole and sole executrix to see this my last Will and Testamen
 performed in Wiltshire where I have set my hands and seal the 9th day of March one thousand
 six hundred and eighty six
