Since the making of my Will on the two other sides of this sheet of paper, I find my Sonne Joseph
Bridger fly out into such a dissolution of life and is grown very discontented to me and that I may
not be guilty by giving him an encouragement to continue in his wicked way of living.
For hereby I give from myself and Daniel all and every part of the legacies given him in my Will for
said part of lands and my personal effects, and do give the lands and possessions whereof I now dwell
and the 800 acres formerly belonging to Captain Weston and the 300 acres formerly belonging
to Mr. Edwards on which he grew up and dwelt and my wife lived with all the denements and what
ever shee belonged after my wifes death to my Sonne Joseph Bridger during his naturall life
and after his death to the heires male of his Body lawfully begotten and for want of such heires I
give it to my Sonne William for his naturall life and after his death to the heires male of his Body law
fully begotten for the one halfe of the land at Cyrawood given to my Sonne Joseph and the land
maritime for hereby to make the said quift, and hereby give it to my Sonne William during his nat
ural life and after to the heires male of his Body lawfully begotten and for want of such heires to
my Sonne Daniel during his life and then to the heires male of his Body lawfully begotten if or
part of my personal effects given to my Sonne Joseph in the said Will I do hereby make the said quift
out of my wife and the rest of my children. And Samuel, William, Martha
many small effects and chattels to be equally divided amongst them it is my Will my Sonne Joseph
shall have payd to him yearly during his naturall life two thousand pounds of tobacco and such
shall have payd to him yearly during his naturall life out of the effects coming in from my lands and to be paid proportionably from every
tract of land according to the denements theron, which my Executor and those it is given to an
account to him yearly during his naturall life and this is in full it is intended shall have hereby ending all gift
to both and it is soe accordingly and this is in full it is intended shall have hereby ending all gift
and effects to him of any lands or personal effects what soeuer. Witness my hand and seal this
18th of October 1683.

I know all men by these presents that Joseph Bridger of the Isle of Wight County in Virginia 1683

Sonne Joseph Bridger be by me dismembered and soe distributed that neither he nor any child of his which
male or female shall have or enjoy any part or portion of any the lands or denements howe soe
soe be, or hereafter shall have and possesse, and do hereby declare and it is my Will that all my lands
and denements with in the Colony of Virginia, or any land and every part thereof doe que to
my two Sons: Samuel Bridger and William Bridger to them and their heires lawfully begot
of their bodies: or as I shall think fit to appoint each his part of the same, and if no such power
be made by me then to be divided betwix them, havinge my wife right during her life
and against that neither my Sonne Joseph Bridger nor any child of his which male or female shall have
more than five pounds sterlings paid him, out of my personal effects, by those shall have the same
ment before, and not more and it is my Will that that five pounds shalbe al, what he shall have
of any estate real or personal that at my deatle shall belonge to me and it is my Will and desire
it againe that neither my Sonne Joseph Bridger nor any child of his which male or female shall have
