 thanks be given to God for the same and knowing the uncertainty of this life on Earth and being
 desirous to settle things in order do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and forme follo-
 wing. First and principally. I Command my Soule to Almighty God my Creator affaynably belonging vnto
 I shall receive full pardon & free remission of all my sin. & be saved by the just & merciful death and merits of
 my blessed Saviour and redemeour Christ Jesus & my body to the Earth where it was beaten to be buried
 indecent manner & dead as touching such worldly estate as I have in this my habitation now my Will
 and testement is this same shall employ it and afterwardes as hereafter by this my Will is appointed &
 first & foremost knowne for me to make void all Wills by me formerly made and then
 appoint this my last Will and Testament.

I give unto my daughter Elizabeth after her death with blankets & ruggs & sheets & bedlinen
 and one young sheep named Syng with her mireas or only the first mireas she bringes her
 give to my daughter Eleanor

I do give to my daughter Elizabeth one feather bed: and feather & quilt to my daughter in
 law Jane Groff one feather bed: as for the remainder of my whole estate after my debts and
 funeral expences payd: it is my Will shall be equally diuided betwixt my wife and children &
 I do constable nominate and appoint my louinge wife Jane & my son Edward my next
 request my louinge friends Col. James Lovell and William Evans to be overseers of this my Will
 in witness whereof I have herte onto putt my hand & seal the day & year and day abovewritten

To all to whom this present Writing shall come I Joseph Senior of the Island about said plantation
 and dwelling in our Lord God our lasting. know ye that I the said Joseph Senior do by this my
 last & Constituting my trusty & wellbeloued may Thomas Carter of James River in Virginia
 Merchant to be in this behalf my true and lawfull attorney for me and in my name and intent
 and commandes him for receipt and recouery in his hands in James River in Virginia Merchant
 at such sumes of tobacco tobacco goods merchandizes debts demands suits of what nature quality or condition
 soever as now are or hereafter shall be due to me or belonging unto me by reason of the above said
 plantation or any other reason or persons what so ever he or them his executors administrators &
 agents shall & be by Bill, Bond, Letter, account, recouery, note, Bill or any other way or
 means whatsoever here & there to do, manage and follow all my
 affairs & business what so ever in said Virginia that shall meete or requeste to be done
 yelding & by this present granting onto my sayd Attorney my full and whole power and authority
 touching the premises or any part thereof by all lawfull ways and meanes what so ever for me or
 in my name & behalf and to my sayd to do & say: but my least power & desire shall suffice therof
 Attache my selfe to be condemned and out of prison to deliue and to recover & receive compoundage
 release & acquit and discharged one attorney or moore for him or bider him to substitute sat by the
 law to execute & further to do & performe what plie thereto aforesaid determine all and
 every other act matter thing & things what so ever that shall be meete & needfull or expedient
 to be done for me or my selfe or expedient in or about the premises or any part thereof
 as alyne in every respect to all intents and purpoyses as I myselfe might or could do
 the same if I were or shold be then and there personally present with the same personally

fully doth recd on hand to be done on & dated in or about the premises or on part thereof in witness
whereof I have hereunto putt my hand and seal the 19th of March 1688,
