Will according to the agreement  
by me witness

In the name of God almighty: Michael Fulgham being sick and unable of body but of sound mind first  
memory do make this my last Will and Testament

I give and bequeath my soul unto the almighty God in whom I trust my brief longing for eternal salvation  
and my body I bequeath unto the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner after my worldly tabernacle  
is given and bequeath as follows

I give unto some Anthony Fulgham: the plantation wherein I now dwelt and highways lawfully begotten  
and I give unto my some Michael Fulgham: the plantation wherein William Baldwin now dwelt and  
his horses lawfully begotten: and if either of them & neighbors should die without issue their children to be  
successors and heirs: also my Will is that my house & other effects may be sold and enjoy the  
revenue and then divide the same between the two sons of Michael Fulgham and if they names then alive of the plantation wherein  
said plantation destroy the town of Widdenshook and if that names then alive of the plantation wherein  
William Baldwin dwelt to go toward the schooling of my youngest child with and if give unto my daughter  
Sarah Fulgham: one hundred acres of land, beginning upon her left side of Fulgham back and including two  
fully begotten: and for the remainder of land I give my daughter Mary: one hundred acres to be  
equally divided: and to their heirs lawfully begotten and if either of them dies without issue then to be  
return to the survivors: they having liberty to make sale on to another: and my Will is that the mill  
my brother Nicholas Fulgham and son Joseph in building & when all charges are paid and the mill  
paid for himself then my part of the profits to go toward the schooling and bringing up my children  
and to remain in my wife's custody until my son Anthony and Michael Fulgham come of age unto  
whom I do give my part of the said mill to be divided when they come: agree to them and their heirs  
lawfully begotten and if either of them to return to the survivors: only my wife and daughter  
to have their total town ground to themselves so long as they live: also my Will is that my Gun  
Carbine & Rapier pistolls and holsters be purchased a mark or marks to her and her other servants  
Equally amongst my children and for the rest of my estate I leave wholly to the disposing of my law  
wife, Anna Fulgham: during the time of Widdenshook: and if she leaves this division to be made  
between her and my children equally and if she makes any division and leaving it with Anna Fulgham my  
whole and sole Executrix: and my Will is that my wife & brothers John Fulgham and Nicholas Fulgham  
have may settle this my last Will and Testament performed as will fitting her and her heirs 17th Feby 1693.
