In the name of God Amen: I Michael Fulgham beinge sick and weak of body but of sound and perfect memory doe make this my last Will and Testament

I give and bequeath my soule unto the almighty God in whom I put my trust hoping for eternal salvation and my body I bequeath unto the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner as for my worldly estate I give and bequeath as followeth

I give unto some Anthony Fulgham: this plantation whereon I now dwell and his heirs lawfully begotten and I give unto my some Michael Fulgham: this plantation whereon Wm. Bldwain now dwelleth and his heirs lawfully begotten: and if either of these my some should dye without issue then to the survivor and to the heirs: also my Will is that my loving wife Anne Fulgham may have and enjoy the said plantation during the term of widowhood and if she marries then the rent of the plantation whereon Wm. Bldwain dwelleth to go towards the schooling of youngest child with and I give unto my daughter Sarah Fulgham: one hundred acres of land lying upon the left side of Michael Fulgham land and his heirs lawfully begotten: and for the remainder of land I give my daughter Mary: one hundred acres and his heirs lawfully begotten: and to the heirs: and if either of them dies without issue then to the survivor: they having liberty to make sale on to another: and my Will is that the mill my brother Nicholas Fulgham and I am joined in building: when all charges are paid: and the mill lived for self: then my part of the profits to go towards the schooling and bringing up my children and to remain in my wife's custody until my some Anthony and Michael Fulgham come of age: unto whom I doe give my part of the said mill to be divided when they come of age: to them and their heirs lawfully begotten: and if either of them dies without issue: only my wife and daughter: to have and to hold some ground to be sold: also my Will is that my some Anne Fulgham: should and hold: to be purchased a man or more: to her and her heirs: and to be equally amongst my children and for the rest of my estate I leave wholly to the disposing of my loving wife Anne Fulgham: during the term of widowhood: and if she marries then a division to be made between her and my children equally: and I doe make my dear and loving wife Anne Fulgham my whole and sole executrix: and my Will is that my wife and daughter John Fulgham and Nicholas Fulgham may see this my last Will and Testament performed: as witness my hand and seal this 17th day of 1699
