

In the Name of God Amen, I Phillip Lupo Lord of the Isle of Wight County in England being at  
 present in health of Body, Intending and willing for London in the Kingdom of England to be kept  
 remain: good land & what else shall: found down unto me: either as here to Phillip Lupo, son of  
 my father or as here to James Lupo my brother or as here to Katherine Morecroft my sister  
 decessed, & being willing that this present estate, which is, it hath pleased the Lord to endue me: yet this  
 in Virginia should be disposed of after my death, not knowing how soon it may please the Lord to send  
 up me, I do therefore dispose of the same now in my present life being in good health & perfect  
 sense & memory, as followeth: viz. for the present estate I now have in Virginia, it is my will that  
 the same be equally divided betwixt my loving wife, Maria Lupo, Phillip Lupo my eldest son:  
 & James Lupo my youngest son, to whom I do hereby Nominate, to be my Joynt & equal: &  
 proportionall: my said exors: paying: all such debts, as I now justly owe in Virginia: & that if  
 is my will, that my said exors: or either of them, pay & deliver unto Mary Elizabeth my daughter, after it  
 shall be found that I am dead not returning to Virginia, one two years old hirsie provided not  
 estate be brought into the County or sent by me out of England, & if any, then shall be sent by me or  
 my order then no: hirsie, to be paid, but shall then pay to my said daughter 1000 of tuns in gold  
 immediately after their receipt of the said good or so much of the said good, equivalent to the said  
 sum of 1000. And that this my will, may be the better performed, I do request my loving friends &  
 friends & Robert Kees to see the same put in execution & to be done by their oversight & care, & that  
 being my last will & testament: & do hereby & do enjoin: all former wills, & laws hereto made  
 hand & seal this 8<sup>th</sup> day of March 1668

 one powder saltcellar, two sawfers, one ring, one small drum, one metal cressant, one new old  
 one new shrike, 1600 of 6<sup>th</sup> nails, 500 of 20: & 10 nails or three valances, one small lantern  
 one great iron pot & pot hooks two black Iron pots & pothooks, one brass kettle, one small  
 brass still, one brass candlestick, one brass skimmer, one rhasing dish, one gridiron one  
 small one, one silver candlestick, one Iron spit one duggingpan, one laton digging pan one  
 laton funnel, one grater, one skimmingpan, one pot rack one smothering Iron, two Iron pestles, one  
 pair of Tongues, one braker, one earthen dish, two earthen pots, two hand saws, two Iron hammers  
 two pairs, one washing tub, one small form, one brass runlet, one sifter, one old chest one box  
 one Iron wedge, one great oblique one pair of pincers, one griddle, one pair of hocks & changed one  
 quart of old Iron, two old tubs, three boxes, two draught pipes, one bull of a year old
