

In the Name of God Amen, I Richard Izard beinge sick in Bed, but of sound mind & perfect memory
doe make this my last will & testament. First I bequeath my soule unto the Almighty God, hopeinge by the
meritts of my sauiour Iesus Christ, to obtaine forgiveness of my sinnes & eternall life; my body I bequeath
vnto the earth, to be buried in a Christian like manner, And for my worldly estate, I bequeath as followeth
(first) after my debts are fully payed

I giue & bequeath vnto my two Daughters Mary Izard & Martha Izard Two third parts, of all my
proper estate, whether in land, Chattell, or any other goodd what soeuer belongeth vnto me
Item I giue & bequeath vnto my wellbeloued wife, Rebecca Izard the other third part of my estate And if in
case that either of my Daughters, Mary & Martha, shall dye before they come to Age: that then my
will is, that the Suruiuer of the aforesaid Mary & Martha, shall haue the aforesaid Two third parts
of my estate wholly & solelie, onely it is my will, that if any one of my two Daughters be Suruiuing &
obtaine the Two thirds of my estate, as aforesaid, that then the Daughter soe Suruiuinge shall pay out of
the aforesaid Two thirds of my estate, vnto James Bagnall the sonne of James Bagnall who there-
fore stand bound of tobacco: Also my will is, that my two Daughters, Mary & Martha remaine wth their
Mother, and also, the Diuident, of my estate bequeathed as aforesaid, And sh^e to haue the charge of it,
vntill they come to Age, likewise make my wellbeloued wife Rebecca Izard my whole & sole executrix
And my will is, that my sonne in law, James Bagnall, be obsequer to this my will and testament
as aforesaid In Witnes wherof, I haue here vnto, sett my hand & seal: this twentieth day of May

Ninth day of June, 1669 By the oathes of Mr John Burchell & Richard
Angell: And then Read, & was soe: James Bagnall the sonne

that I doo witness, that I Charles Dufare, Churcheing to the last request of Elizabeth Jones, who was the consort
and good liuinge of John Jones, her husband, haue retained & taken Joye wth the daughter of the aforesaid

to provide for, vntill the 1st of night cominge, shall think her fit, to be otherwise disposed of And also
I doo hereby acquitt & discharge the said John Jones, from any & all debts or charges, which he was bound to
him, beloninge, remittinge the said Joye, provided, that the said John Jones, the next day to be held for the
County, doe then & there, cause to be Recorded, for the use of the said Joye, and her heirs for ever, first one
called couer & one some some raffe, and one hufier of three yards old or thereabouts, if sh^e doe not before the said
Court, And if the aforesaid Joye, die before sh^e come to Age, or married, then the aforesaid, shall wth the
whole marriage to be to the use of the said Charles Dufare, & his heirs for ever, witness my hand this 8 day of
of May 1669
