 do make this my last will & testament. First I bequeath my soule unto the Almighty God, hopinge by the
 Meritts of my Saviour Iesus Christ to obtaine forgiveness of my sinnes & eternall life; my Body I bequeath
 unto the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner, And for my worldly estate I bequeath as followeth
 (First) after my debts are fully payed

I give I give and bequeath unto my two Daughters Mary Izard & Martha Izard Two third parts, of all my
 proper estate, whiche in lands, Chattells, or any other goodd what soever belongeth unto me

Item I give & bequeath unto my well-beloued wife, Rebecca Izard the other third part of my estate And if she
 shall die before of my Daughters, Mary & Martha, shall die before they come to Age, that then my
 will is that the Survivoor of the aforesaid Mary & Martha, shall have the aforesaid Two third parts
 of my estate wholly & solely, only it is my will, that if any one of my two Daughters be Survivoor &
 obtaine the Two thirds of my estate, as aforesaid, that then the Daughter so Survivoor shall pay out of
 the aforesaid Two thirds of my estate, unto James Bagnall, the sonne of James Bagnall two thou-
 sand poundes of tobacco: Also my will is that my two Daughters, Mary & Martha remaine my three
 Moother, and also, the Diuident, of my estate bequeathed as aforesaid, And she to have the charge of it,
 untill they come to Age, likewise made my well-beloued wife Rebecca Izard my whole & sole executrix
 And my will is, that my sonne in law, James Bagnall, be overseer to this my will and testament
 as aforesaid In Witness whereof, I have hereunto, sett my hand & seal, this twentieth day of May
 Anno Domini 1669

This will is proved in the open Court held for the Shire of Wight County this
 ninth day of June, 1669 By the oathes of Mr John Burchell & Richard
 Angles, and then recorded, at the Court of the said County

The said witness, that Charles Dufare, Chording, to the last request of Elizabeth Jones, and was the consent
 and good liking of John Jones, her husband, have returned & taken Joyce Wollard the daughter of the aforesaid
 Elizabeth & Henry Wollard Dirasid, with said Joyce I do hereby bind my self to look carefull, after & sufficient
 to provide for, untill the 1st of night Comyn Court, shall think her self, to be otherwise disposed of And also
 I do hereby acquitt & discharge the said John Jones, from any care, trouble or charge, in regard to
 him, belonging, remaining, the said Joyce, provided, that the said John Jones, the next Court to be held for the
 County, do then & there, cause to be recorded, for the use of the said Joyce, and her heirs for ever, cert. on, how
 called, couage & one sowe rowe raffe, and one hiesher of three yards old or thereabouts, if she die, not before the said
 Court, and if the aforesaid Joyce die before she cometh to Age, or married, then the aforesaid, Chattell, with the
 whole moneys to be to the use of the said Charles, Dufare, & his heirs for ever, witness my hand this 8 day of
