In the name of God Amen I Richard Lewes of the lower parish of the Isle of Wight County being sick and weak in body but of perfect sense in mind and unmoved doe make this my last Will and Testament: first I bequeath my soule into the hands of almighty God my maker and to His Chr:st my saviour and Redeemer and my soule to be buried in decent maner according: as Sarah my loving wife shall see fit: and my worldly goods which it hath pleased god to endow me with all I bequeath in maner and form as followeth

July 23

I give and bequeath to my sonne Richard Lewes: that plantation which William Duck now lieth upon with all the land and pertinances thereto belonging: which is myne I say I give it to my sonne Richard Lewes and his heires for ever: and it is my desire that William Duck forthwith after my decease take my sonne Richard Lewes in tuition to learn him to read: and wright I say in tuition for so long tyme as the foresaid Wm Duck hath now by li: at upon the foresaid plantation: altho I give to my sonne Richard Lewes one good flocke Bed and boulders and one good shagge rugg and one good blanket: and one paire of good sufficient Camis shirts: and also one Iron pott of about four gallons bignesse and three pintes diths Contyning ten pound weight

July 23

I give unto my sonne Thomas Lewes and his heires for ever that parcell of land of our hundred with the several acres: which I have lately litten onto sandy Cullis: bound'd as the parcell of the sayd land doth direct with the parcell now thereto belonging: and one good flocke Bed and boulders and one good shagge rugg and one good blanket and one paire of good sufficient Camis shirts: and one Iron pott of about four gallons bignesse or three gallons bignesse and three pintes diths Contyning ten pound weight

July 23

I give to my daughter Anne Lewes one good flocke Bed and boulders and one good shagge rugg & one good blanket and one paire of good sufficient Camis shirts and one good Iron pott Contyning three or four gallons bignesse and three pintes diths Contyning ten pound weight: and two Cows from four yeares ould to stand with each Cow a Calf by her side to be d: in the tyme of her marriage: or else at sixteen yeares of age

July 23

I give to my daughter Elizabeth Lewes one good flocke Bed and boulders and one good shagge rugg and one good blanket and one paire of good sufficient Camis shirts: and one good Iron pott Contyning three or four gallons bignesse and three pintes diths Contyning ten pound weight: and two Cows from four yeares ould to stand with each Cow a Calf by her side: to be d: in the tyme of her marriage: or else at sixteen yeares of age

July 23

I give unto Sarah my loving wife: excepting the legacies aforesaid give all the rest of my estate movable and immovable that belongs to this plantation which it hath pleased god to endow me with all I say during her life: or widow hood: but if it happen that she marry my desire is that she should which I now leave her may be d: and the one halfe to belong to the Child she now gets with all: but if it please god the said Child should dy: in its minority: then I leave it to my loving wife's disposing: and my desire that the yearly profits of my two plantations during the tyme of the said Childs may belong to Sarah my loving wife for the good of her maintenance: and my children: but in case my wife should marry before the tyme of the aforesaid Childs arrivance: then it is my desire that the yearly profits belonging to me of my two foresaid plantations shall be paid
