to my sonne Richard Lewis one good flocke bird and boulster, and one good Ragg[e] egg and one
good blanke: and one pair of good sufficient Canis shirts: and also one iron pot of about
fourte gallons bignesse and three powdered dishes Conteyning ten pound weight

I give unto my sonne Thomas Lewis and his heires for ever: that parcell of land of our h[er]e with
pertinencies thereto, which I have lately lettyn to John Cullen: bound it as the parcell of land and
pertinencies thereto to him to belonge: and one good flocke bird and boulster and
one good blanke and one pair of good sufficient Canis shirts: and also
one iron pot of about fourte gallons bignesse and three powdered dishes Conteyning ten pound weight: and two Calves
from fourte yeare oulde to stautn with each Cow a Calf by her selfe to be delivred at the tym[e]

I give to my daughter Elizabeth Lewis: one good flocke bird and boulster and one good Ragg[e] egg &
one good blanke and one pair of good sufficient Canis shirts and one iron pot Conteyning

the tym[e] of her marriage: or else at fiftene yeare of age.

children: but in case my wifte should marrie before the tyme of their aforesaid lands and disposed
then it is my desir that the yearly profits belongeth to me of my two aforesaid plantations shall yeare

put to good use by my executors for the good of my two daughters. Alice and Elizabeth to be equally divided between them: and at the signature of the testator of this instrument William Smith James Carter what stocks of hogs, and cattle one each plantation not excepted, he them and their heirs for ever, but which belongs severally to each plantation about excepted, he them and their heirs for ever, but if it please God either one or both of my two sons Richard, or Thomas should die without issue their land and estate given to them by me shall lawfully fall to my two daughters Alice and Elizabeth and their heirs: and further my desire is that in case my wife cannot maintain my children, or should marry to that then in Breffin, take in tuition my daughter Alice Carter and her children fully to be in Tuition, my sonne Thomas will be remunerated yearly of £100, on condition hee leaves him in Right and wrong. But if it please God to Gideon and his wife should die before her by reason of death, that then my sonne Thomas may Anfate: and Richard Reynolds and Elizabeth his wife take in tuition my daughter Elizabeth: and my desire is that Thomas joyntly with Richard Reynolds and my daughter Elizabeth: and my desire is that Thomas joyntly with Richard Reynolds and my loving friends for this my last Will and Testament performed to the best of their understanding in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 13th of October 1692.
