be to the above children to duly & truly deliver  
to them at the years above expressed, & y<sup>t</sup> he see my  
debts & funeral charges payd, & see retaking all former  
wills I have herewith to my hand & seal this 5<sup>th</sup>  
day of 9. mo. 1692.
