In the name of God Amen this 28th day of Sept 1686 I Richard Woollen of the Isle of Wight County being
sick in body but of good and perfect memory whereby to be god for male and ordaine this to be my last Will and
Testament in manner and forme following: First I give and leave my soule to God my Lawer and Etende and my
body to be buried in such church or churche as my Executor shall think fit and as to my worldly Estate giving as
followeth all my just debts being fifteen pounds

I give and bequeath unto my son Richard all this plantation now lying on to him and his heirs for ever only
my sonne Thomas to have and hold the plantation in full freedom of all tithes and
I give unto my sonne Thomas all that plantation which Francis Floyd now hath by him for ever
the rest of my estate I give and bequeath betweene my louing wife and three children my louing wife to
enjoy the whole during her widow hood but after her marriage the said estate to be equally divided betwixt
her and three children, provided first hereby make my louing wife whole and sole Executrix
Proved by Constitutable witness Henry Baker our witness to this my last Will in witness whereof I have set my hand and sealed this day and year about written

I Richard Woollen of the Isle of Wight County being through the mercy of the Lord in perfect health now
and memory doth make this my last Will and Testamente in manner and forme following:
I give and bequeath unto my sonne Richard Woollen the two hundred acres of land with all the houses and build-
ings therin belonginge and to his children after him: and for want of issue then I give and bequeath it to
my sonne Christopher and his children: and for want of issue to my sonne Christopher then I give and bequeath it to
my sonne John and his children: and for want of issue to my sonne John then I give and bequeath it to my daughter
Elizabeth Sam: Mary and Eliza and their children for ever.
I give and bequeath unto my daies self during my naturall life the now dwelling house with all other houses
and one hundred acres of land adjoyninge thereto being part of the aboue mentioned two hundred acres
of land and after her decess when to goe up above bequeathed
as for my personal estate it is my will it be divided into three parts the one thid part I give to my wife and
for her children three and give it to be equally diuided amongst my children that now have or shall have at my
death to be paid them by my Executor at the age of twenty one yeare and if any of them dyd before
they come to age then to be equally diuided amongst them that surviuue. I nominate and appoint my deare wife
Elizabeth Woollen Executrix of this my last Will and Testamente and making all former Wills further
more doth appoint John Copeland Daniel Sandburne William Cudoland and Edmond Wilson Cud Sise to
see this my Will performed In witness whereof I have set my hand and sealed this sixt day
of September one thousand eight hundred eighty and six
