 her and three children, further I do hereby make my loving wife whole and sole executrix
 I do hereby constitute and ordaine Henry Chatter our deere to this my last Will in witness whereof I have hereunto

 versities thereto belonging and to his children after him: and for want of issue then I give and bequeath it to
 my sonne Cornelius and his children: and for want of issue to my sonne Cornelius: then I give and bequeath it
 to my sonne John: and his children: and for want of issue to my sonne John: then I give and bequeath it to my daughter
 Elizabeth: Sara: Mary and Rebecca and their children for ever
 I give and bequeath unto my deare wife duringe her natural life the new dwelling house with all other diti
 and one hundred acres of land adjoininge thereto being part of the above mentioned two hundred acres
 of land and after her death then to be equally divided amongst my children that I now have or shall have at my
 death as for my personal estate it is my Will it be divided into three parts: the one third part I give to my wife and
 for the other two thirds I give it to be equally divided amongst my children that I now have or shall have at my
 death to be paid them by my Executors at the age of twenty and one years: and if any of them dye before
 they come to age: then to be equally divided amongst them that survive I nominate and appoint my deare wife
 Elizabeth Rakecliffe executrix of this my last Will and Testament revoking all former Wills further
 more I do appoint John Copeland Daniel Sandburne William Cudoland and Edmond Bilson our deere to
