The humble request of Mary Wift

Humbly desirous that these cattle here intituled may be reserved for my children.

To my eldest sonne William Wift I give unto him one blacke gelding called pintoone marked as followeth that is crept on each ear & a halfe moone on the upper side of each ear & a white stripe each ear with all his female inmates

To my second sonne Henry Wift I give unto him one browned pinto gelding about two years old of the same marks the other is only a hole in the right ear with his female inmates

To my daughter Mary Wift I give unto her one mostly black heifer about two years old and one white heifer both Calves with all the rest female inmates they are marked with the first only a slit in the right year

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Poole aged about sixty years or thereabout being in my last memory praysd to God for the favor and grace to be my last will and testament in manner and forme as followeth: first I doth bequeath my soule to God who gave it me: and my body to the earth to be buried in such manner as my louing wife thinkes fit and convenient and for my worldly goods I doth make my louing wife Christian Poole the whole and sole executrix of this my last will and testament only I do give the residue of the five hundred acres of land which I now doth conteyn in my Grand child poole Hawle to her and his heirs for ever after the decease of his Grand Mother Christian Poole and what enderlants appon the said plantation is not to spoile Wift nor timber appon the said plantation but what is for the good of the plantation and as for the hundred acres of land wheron John Hawle lyes I do give it to my Grand child John Hawle to he and his heirs for ever also I do give my grand child Poole Hawle one mare three years old and the cartage with a plow man and Taylor Croft and slit in the right year and Swallow fence in the left and the said Poole Hawle to have her inmates and what inmates she bringes and not to keep above three or four and what inheritance more to be turned into what his parents thinkes best of for his use also I give to his grand mother for taking of a course for his shollings for it is my will that he should live with his grand mother for so longe as she liveth after I give to poole Hawle one mireland to be ready fitt for his use and my swounds and gifts allonge due unto my
