 my doth Comend my soule to the almighty God of Heaven who gave it me and he send my body to the
 earth to be buried in decent and Christian like manner: I hereby Give give and bequeath: wholly unto
 my wellbelovd daughter: Jane Edwards: two Maids one aged sixteen years and the other beinge
 two years ould likewise I do give unto her my 10 daughters one hour: aged three years ould one
 of the Maids beinge now with foale likewise I do give unto her what Cattle doth and shall belonge
 to me: after the death of my sonne I have had his share out of the stocke of Cattle: which belongeth to
 the plantation of the s^r Louis growe and likewise the Hoggs to be equally shared betwene my daughter
 Jane Edwards and the s^r Louis growe and also what trifles belongeth to the house that in Lent
 growe hath taken an Inventory on: only my set of Carpenters tools I do freely and Graciously
 give unto John Cogger so that is to say one broad axe one adze one drawinge knife one hand saw
 three shovels one auger one gouge and one hamer also I desire that my daughter Jane Edwards
 may live and Continue with Mr. John: Moores of Bookland in the Western branch of Narramund
 while she remaineth or dwelleth by age of one and twenty years from the date of this my last
 Will and Testament she beinge now five years ould Com^e February next: and that what estate
 I have left her beinge properly my owne: as above mentioned may be putt into some honest mans hand
 as the Court shall thinke fitt while the s^r Louis shall Come of age and that he or they may putt in due
 vnto the Court for the performance of the delivery of that small estate when she shall be of age to
 require the same this I do certify and Confirm acknowledginge this to be my last Will and Testament
 without any other Will or obligation that may or shall for the future Come in force against
 me nor that after John Moores death and his wife: my daughter Jane may returne to John
 Cogger and his wife to Continue the rest of her time as Witness my hand and Seale in the year of

The Humble request of Mary Wiff

Humbly desireth that these Cattle here interited may be recorded for my children:

To my eldest son William Wiff I give unto him one black p^{ar}son Cow & a black p^{ar}son mare, as followeth that is Cropt on each ear & a halfe moone one the upper side of each ear & a white D^{ar} on each ear with all her female increase

To my second son Henry Wiff I give unto him one branded p^{ar}son Cow & a black p^{ar}son mare aboute two yeards oulde of the same make the other is only a hole in the right ear with her female Increase

To my daughter Mary Wiff I give unto her one black & white p^{ar}son Cow & a black p^{ar}son mare they are marked as the first only a slit in the right ear

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Poole aged aboute sixty yeares or there aboute being in perfect memory prayeth to God for the soul of my late father & my late mother and Testament in maner and forme as followeth: first I do bequeath my soule to God who gave it me: and next my Body to the Earth to be buried in such maner as my loving wife thinks fitt and convenient and for my worldly good I doe make my loving wife Christian Poole the whole and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament only I doe give the residue of the five hundred acres of land: wherupon I now dwell unto my Grand child poole Hawle: to her and his heirs for ever after the decease of his Grand mother Christian Poole and what ever lyes upon the sayd plantation is not to spoile Waste nor timber: upon the sayd plantation but what is for the good of the plantation: and as for the hundred acres of land wherupon John Hawle lives I doe give it to my Grand child John Hawle: to her and his heirs for ever after I doe give my Grand child Poole Hawle: one mare three yeares oulde: and the vantage: with a floater mare and tayle: Cropt and slit in the right ear: and swallow foote in the left and the sayd Poole Hawle: do have her increase: and what increase she brings and nett to keep above her or fowes: and what increase more to be turned into what his parents thinks best of for his use: also I give to his Grand mother for takinge a Course for his schooling: for it is my Will that he should live with his Grand mother for longe as she liveth after I give to poole Hawle one musket to be ready first for his use and my sword and belt also I doe give to my
