In the Name of God Amen Robert Marshall being sick & weak of body but of perfect memory & understanding doth be almighty God for it doth make this my last will & Testament in manner & form as followeth

I bequeath my soule to Almyty God that gaved it in assured hope through y^e Meritts of my Saviour Iesus Christ to inheroll Evermall life my body to y^e Earth to be decently buried according to discretion of my Excutrix which shall Nominato; and for y^e rest of my personall Estate I bequeath in manner & forms as followeth

I give unto my son Robert Marshall my long gun & my son & Robert a new lether girdell & one Whitfaced hooft about three years old & my chest with lock & has to it & my Coopers & Carpenders tools Excepting one broad Ax & Carpenders axe & the new Coopers axe and y^e hand Sator & two Chisells one small Auger & gouge

I give unto my son Robert Marshall my land at tother side y^e stream where In^o Berin lives to him & his heires for ever & as for the ^{other} ^{part} of my land I have given to my son Robert Marshall my will is that the same be divided in two parts my wife Mary to have one half & Robert half to be equally divided amongst my other Children that is to say In^o, Elizath, Humphrey, Joseph, Mary & James, to be equally divided amongst them to be paid to them when they come to the age of one & twenty or are married

I give to my son In^o my land where In^o Chardan lives to him & his heires for ever but my wife to have it during her life

I give to my son Humphrey y^e land with my father Lichens penny gavel to me called the pime I give to my son Humphrey & his heires for ever but my son Robert to have y^e Legat and the ^{other} ^{part} I will to him but my son Robert will not make over & acknowledge it in Co^{rt} of Leon y^e said land to my son Humphrey & his heires for ever from him & his heires that then my will is that the said land with I gave to my son Robert & his heires that my son Humphrey & his heires to it for ever and if my son Humphrey dies without heires lawfully begotten that then my son Joseph

and his heirs to have it for ever & if son Robt does refuse to make over
the land all the prime as above said then it is my will that what Legacies I gave
to my son Robt Marshall out of my personal estate be divided amongst the
rest of personal estate as above said & my son Robt Marshall to have
but half a Crown to y^e further Confirmation of this my last will & Testament
I Naming & appoint my well beloved wife Mary Marshall my whole &
sole Ex^{or} of this my last will & Testament as witness my hand and seal
this 15th day of July 1698
