Item I give & bequeath as a gift of my direct gift, Martha Pitt, one parcel of land situate about the plantation that Robert Bartholomew, now living on, & herewith appon the North side of my land now in John Edwards, for the length, And the breadth towards the Church, appon the land, with way for my son or my land my Executors, is to build one house of twenty five feet, in length again four years after my death, which for said land & house, is to be for the welfare, of poor women, And there comes.

And if it should please God, to take away out of this life any one of my Grandchildren, to whom I have given my land, before the death of my son, John Pitt, then his part of the land, shall be disposed of all the discretion of my son, John Pitt, & what land shall be known, & land given to my Grandson, William Pitt.

I do hereby certify, all former wills & do make my son, John Pitt, my Executors of this my last will & testament, in witness whereof I have signed this my last will & testament, the 9th day of June, 1672.
