I give unto my son: Robert Lee, one mare two sons, two brass kettles, & two pewter plates / I give unto my daughter Margaret Lee, my father's bed, with her by: upon, with one pair of blankets and one pair of sheets, & a red rug & hamster, I give also to my said daughter, the first mare she, that my son Robert Lee, shall bring to me, & two cows, one brass pan, & two pewter dishes / I give it is my will, that my said son, shall, paid his legacies, all the day of his life one year, after my daughter at her day of marriage, but if it shall please God, to take either of my said children out of this life, before they come to the age of 21 years, I give my said children, to enjoy the several things that I have bequeathed unto them, until they come to the age of 21 years, to enjoy the same for good & mine, to my said children. I give I give to my loving wife, Jane Lee, the paring all my just debts, & legacies, the woman's part of my estate, be it in what Nature qualities or condition whatsoever, & to her I do make my full & sole executor, of this my will; I give it is my will, that if my wife should die, before my children be of age, that my loving friend, Thomas More, & Elias Fox, whom I do desire, to be my executors, to take into their hands, my children's estate, until they come to the age of 21 years, I give my last will & testament, & bequeathing all forms with, I have hereunto set my hand & seal, this 28. day of December, 1675
