

A true & perfect Inventory of all and singular household goods, Cattle and Chattels of Mr. George Branch directed to be taken the 18th day of May 1688 in the presence of George Branch James Lupo Francis Branch John Branch and John Branch

Three feather beds with blankets, huggs, boulters and pillows, two beds of Curtains and Ballnet, one new rugge and one page of new blankets. Three pair of sheets, 2 without covers, 3 napkins, 2 table cloths, 2 towels, his wearing apparell being a coat, breeches, waistcoat, shirt, half neckcloth and 2 pair of shoes and stockings, Eight yards of Callicott, Cotton

Two iron pots, one iron kettle, 2 brass kettles, one skillet, one warming pan, six pewter dishes, 2 pewter basons, 19 spoons, 6 saucers, 4 plates, one flagon, one tankard, one Card table, a salt cellar

Two pair of tongs, one pot rack, 2 iron hooks, 2 iron dogs, a gridiron, one spit, one pottle, an iron tangle, one frying pan, 3 wadded a string hamms,

Two fouling peeces, one musket, 2 pistols, one rapier and bill

one latten pot, a mug, jugge, a pike, a gallon pot, 2 Chamber pots, 2 butter dishes, one latten span, one set of Carpenter tools, 2 broad axes, 4 augers, 3 shovels, one scrow, one hammer, 3 gimlets, 4 saws, a drawing knife, an ad, a hand plane, a fore plane, and one with

Two piggs, one pash, 3 small Cask, a gallon runlet, a tin funnel, a wire Card table, about 2000 of 10th nayles, about 50 great nayles

one Cuck, one small kattle, 4 low chairs, 5 leather chairs, one long table and forme, 2 chairs, a horse stool, one page of flack matts, a pair of flammets, from Camel to Cuck, Lovers, a dooking, from a small page of Compost, one page of small flack, 3 Cates of leape, 2000 of milke buttons, Three bristles, a bill, one bush, a looking glass, a gridstone, a pair of baggs, a cutting knife, a smacking iron, a pair of washers, for a cart, a shackle, one, about 10 bushels of salt, about 1 pair barrels of Corn

Two meate trays, 2 sifters, a layer, Cloak to dry maul, one negro boy named Tom, that hath about 200000 in his hand

Two brooch, hooft, one mare, and mare, white, 2 saddle, 2 bridles, 2 ropes, two and twenty head of Cattle, young and oulde, about 63 hoggs, young and oulde, one cart and wheelbarrow, 3 yokes, one thim, about 300 pounds in plate, 3 sheep, about 80 of them, and one pound halfe of powder, 6 round bottles, one pottle, bottle a puffed with one pound of butter, fillings and six pint, Starling, in it

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Harris of the County of Wight being sick and weak in body, but in sound and perfect memory, doe first and primarily bequeath my soul unto god almighty who gave it, and secondly my body to the earth to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner and doe ordaine this to be my last will and testament in manner and forme as followeth

I doe give and bequeath unto my wellbelov'd Sonne Edward Harris my plantation that now I live on with all my lands belonging to it, the same to him and his heirs for ever, also one yoke of draught steers, with a cart belonging unto them, also one great shep and eight ells of sheering Canvas, these from Widdow one free, one small frying pan, two pewter dishes, one silver tinnen the other, one large frying pan, one iron pottle, two sheets, one small table, one Couch

also I doe give unto my wellbelov'd Sonne John Harris, one great iron pot, two pewter dishes, one silver tinnen the other, one large frying pan, one iron pottle, two sheets, one small table, one Couch

also I doe give unto my wellbelov'd Sonne Thomas Harris, four pewter dishes and a flagon, two salt cellars, one small iron pot, one low one key for of two years oulde and 300000 of heys

also I doe give unto my wellbelov'd Sonne Robert Harris, one bed being part of flack and feathers with all the furniture thereunto belonging, one small Gun, one horse, to be sould for his use

I doe give unto my wellbelov'd daughter Jane Jones eight milke trays, I doe give and bequeath unto my wellbelov'd daughter Anne Harris, one bed, I doo by reason with the furniture thereunto belonging, but in last shew doo before the Cometh of age, for marriage then the bed with what beforgeth

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shall fall to my some Robert Harris also I give her a large bag of salt and
 one Iron pot containing two or three gallons with two dishes
 but if she dyeth that the same like will fall to Robert and John Harris
 I also desire that what Cattle is left that is not here in disposicion may be sold
 and like with my stock of hogs to be sold after my death being
 paid debts ments for a desire like out of what estate I have now growing
 on the plantation if it please god it cometh to maturity. the same to be sold like
 with the Cattle and what hogs may be left after the death of my said part
 the same to be sold to the profitablest use as may be thought fit by my son
 Edward Harris, being my whole executor and John Fulgham and John Turner
 they two persons being appointed my overseers of this my last will and testa-
 ment they with my executor, to advise to the disposal of the said Cattle hogs and
 what to the best advantage for the good of my three youngest sons George Harris
 Martin Harris & William Harris only two pence dishes to be purchased and one
 Iron pot, out of the produce to be delivered to Robert Harris, and the remainder
 to be equally divided betwixt the said George Harris Martin Harris and William
 Harris, and likewise I desire that these three boys left mentioned as Robert Harris
 George Harris and Martin Harris to remaine this present year, upon the plan-
 tation, and afterwards that Robert Harris may dwell with John Fulgham three
 years, and George Harris to dwell with John Turner four years and Martin
 Harris, to remaine with his brother Edward Harris five years and my some
 William Harris to live with Bridgeman Jyners three years and likewise my
 daughter Anne to live with Mrs. Anne Sharp three years if the said Mrs. Anne
 Sharp shall live so long
 further I desire that my some Edward Harris being my executor in death or my
 appointed overseers in John Fulgham in John Turner that is the more it her
 of them shall find that any of my children that is placed out as aforesaid shall
 that then either of them may have the liberty of returninge them to some other
 place when they shall thinke fit
 one thing more I bequeath unto these of my goods children a cow calf a pig
 to them & increase of the same. Thus writinge and concluding this to be my last
 will and testament and do revoke and annulle any alther will or testament
 from or by me made as witness my hand and seal this fourth day of March in
 the year of our Lord God 1687
