 Katherine; Margaret and Sarah Ogilthorpe after my debts are paid to be equally divided amongst
 them, also it is my desire that my eldest daughter doth tarry on the plantation provided she be
 not wast made of any thing; and if it should please gods that one or more of my daughters should dy
 without heirs it shall fall to the next living; it is my desire that my daughters enjoy my lands & him
 and their heirs for ever: and in last; my daughters all should dy without heirs I give my land
 unto Richard Thomas his eldest son to him and his heirs for ever also I do devise my loving
 friends Simon Ewrick and John Ewrick and Richard Thomas to be my overseers and do appoint
 my two youngest daughters my whole and sole Executors: I make this my last Will and Testament
 Revoked all other Wills formerly by me made: In Witness whereof I have set my hand and seal
 this last day of March 1687

That being sent call by me in the Company of Giles Linscott of Middlesex Giles say that the
 longest lived of Robert firm: and he was to have both their Estates: If I should have any of my
 estate I would burne it all this discourse was not above eight or ten days before his death
 I should have said before that: and I should have said to Robert firm: what he had to make the
 remainder of his: for say a Giles I am busy and shall drop away before long: for he said it for
 by first let me have the one half of it and keep the other for thy self: and I will do it he said
 the last day before me: for we will not want Robert as long as we do live and many words more
 to this purpose & he said he said not
