I give unto my dear and beloved one daughter Elizabeth Hocking and for all the rest of worldly goods which she shall desire unto my loving wife Elizabeth Hocking and doe make her my whole and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament as Witness my hand this 20th day of March 1684

I give and bequeath all my proper estate as Debtor and party equally to be divided between
Burnell my sonne and Eliza his wife the wife of Jonathan Shipley also I give unto Eliza his wife
twenty pounds sterling of the money which lieth in my sonne M^r Colly hands, and the other three pounds
I give and bequeath to my daughter Susanna Couley, for all my wearings apparel I give unto John
Burnell he payme^t of his due 200 of Debtor for my funeral it is my desire that I shall be decently
interred according to the discretion of the Executors hereafter mentioned in Joseph Woody and Coll Arthur
Smith and James Cullagh be Executors of this my Will Octob^r 20th 1685 In Burnell Seal

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Parker aged fifty six years or there about doth ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner as followeth First I doe bequeath my soule to god, who gave it me, and next I doe bequeath my body to the ground to be buried in a distant maner as my loving wife shall think fit

First I doe bequeath unto my eldest sonne John all the Islands that goes in the name of
Huckle Islands, a young blacke mare with a starre in the forehead, two cows and a
steele of four years old, one feather Bed and Rugg, one Iron pott and two pewter
plates and I give unto sonne John six Barrowes and six shoat hoggs Next I doe give
and bequeath unto my sonne Thomas all the land that is out of the Islands and Thomas is to let my
sonne John have timber as he hath occasion for the use of his land, and likewise give
my sonne Thomas a feather Bed and Rugg and two cows when they come to age
and two pewter plates, and one small Iron pott and four hoggs, and also I give
unto sonne Thomas the bowle fast bay mare

I give unto sonne Francis four young Cows when he cometh of age, and one young
ouldred mare, and one feather Bed and Rugg and two pewter plates, and a bra
welle that holdes about ten gallons
and I give and bequeath unto my sonne George four Cows when he cometh of age

Will is that my Wife shall devise my Sonne George a young & man of two yeares old when he Cometh of age if he marries to bring Cotts. and also I give him a table of Silver and two pewter plates and one Iron pot

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth two Cowes and six young & Cudds when she Cometh of age and two pewter plates. and likewise I will my Sonne John shall pay my daughter Elizabeth when she Cometh of age one thousand pounds of Tobacco or goods out of his portion as she shall require it. And likewise I give unto my daughter Mary two Cowes and six Sheep. and my Will is that my Sonne Thomas is pay unto my daughter Mary when she Cometh of age one thousand pounds of Tobacco or goods out of his portion as she shall require it. and pewter plates I give unto my daughter Mary

I bequeath give unto my youngest daughter Anne two Cowes and six young & Cudds and a horse of five yeares old and a silver Saddle Capps when she Cometh of age

I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife all the remainder of whole estate both with in Doors and without and I appoint my loving Wife to be my whole and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament, for the true & forwarrant of this my last will and Testament I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 16th day of November 1688

In the name of God Amen the one and twentieth day of October in the two and thirtieth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord Charles the second by the grace of God of England &c King and in the year of our Lord 1680 William Richardson of the County of Wright in the County of Virginia planter being in good and perfect health of Body and of sound and perfect memory prayed to God for the same, and did say and declare that his last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say first and principally I commend my soul unto the hands of almighty God my native hoping assuredly through the only merits of Jesus Christ my Saviour to be made partaker of everlasting life and I commend my Body to the earth whereof it was made to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and whereas I stand seized and possessed of an estate containing two hundred acres of land of the same moon or less lying in the County and parish of Stafford being part of a patent given and granted unto me the said William Richardson under the hand of the honorable Sir Wm Berkeley Knight and late Governor and Capt General of Virginia and under the seal of the said Colony and Surveys and bounded by Capt Charles Allen Surveyor of the said County of the City of Wright as by the said Patent and Copy of the said Survey under the hand of the said Capt Allen at large may appear it is my Will and mind that the said lands be disposed of in manner following that is to say that the said estate of lands together with all the housing out housing gardens &c with all the appurtenances to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining be divided into two equal parts or shares the one part whereof I do hereby give unto Katherine my now loving Wife for and during the term of her natural life and for the other half it is my Will and mind that I do hereby give and bequeath it unto Mary Wife for the duration and term of years of her life and for the other half I do hereby give and bequeath it unto my now daughter Elizabeth shall have attained unto lawfull years to possess the same or the said Elizabeth shall fortune to marry and after the death and decease of the said Katherine my now Wife I do hereby give and bequeath her half of the said lands unto the said Mary Wife for and during the term of her natural life and after her death and decease then it is my Will and mind that I do hereby give and bequeath all the said lands together with all the appurtenances to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining unto Elizabeth daughter of the said Mary and the heirs of the Body of the said Elizabeth lawfully
