

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Pitt of the town of Argle County in Virginia being in
 good health and perfect mind and remembrance do make and ordain this my last will and testament
 in manner and form as followseth.

I Command my soule unto almighty God my maker & creator and redeemer and my body to a burial by
 my children who I have distributed in this form of right and convenient distribution by mine executors
 I give and bequeath all my lands & tenements and my chattels personal & movables unto my
 sonnes and after my decessall and my funeral expenses performed give and bequeath unto my
 daughter Mary Pitt her first shire of two of my neigbor as also of give unto my said daughter
 Mary Pitt her two diamond rings her wedding ring and manill ringe with all her wert thing appurten-
 ent thereto of parcels.

Item I give unto my steaun children that is to say Thomas Martha Mary Elizabeth Henry and patinet
 Pitt the wife of my neigbor: and bequeath after my wife haue made her first choice of her two neig-
 bor as haue given her about said day I give that remaining part of my neigbor to be equally divided amon-
 g them among them steaun children as they shall come to the age of twenty one yeare or if they or
 any one of them marrie to haue his or her proportion of what remain-
 ing of thir neigbor Pitts land or any other remaining part to be in my executors hands or custody for the use
 shrowd of the wife of my steaun.

Item I give unto my steaun and louing wife Mary Pitt the one fift part of all my estate & heretofore my lands
 and riggorts, the neigbor Pitt haue given as above sayd, and my lands shall give as following: and bequeath
 fourteene parts of my estate to give unto my steaun children that is to say Thomas Martha Mary Eliza-
 beth Henry Anne & patinet Pitt to haue share and share alike and to be equally divided when they
 or any one of them comis to the age of twenty one yeare or marriy
 that then him or her shall for Comis to age or marriy shall haue the two parts called a childs part of w
 is about given, in the mean time untill entry shrowd part to remain in my executors hand till they comis to
 age or marriy as about sayd, but if it shall happen as God for bid that any of my children die before
 they comis to the age of twenty one yeare or marriy that then his or her part for dying shall be
 equally divided amongst my surviving children.

Item I give unto my steaun and louing wife Mary Pitt the plantation now lieing one with the plantation and
 joyntes as farre as the Cark reach that goeth from John Champs alias Coloneil Bacons plantation
 to toward the church and soe joyntes to Thomas Pitt. I say give and bequeath all that lands to my
 louing wife Mary Pitt for and during her naturall life. And bequeath the housing orchard in
 reversion and after his decease I give all the above said lands to my sonne Thomas Pitt for and
 during his naturall life and after his decease to the heire of his body lawfully begotten for ever and
 for want of such heires then to my sonne Henry Pitt for and during his naturall life and after
 his decease to the heire of his body lawfully begotten for ever and for want of such heires then
 to be equally divided amongst my five daughters and their heires for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my sonne Thomas Pitt all that plantation that I bought of James Bellin
 wch Thomas Bellins now heth & Jacob Barnis, with the plantation where Henry Pitt now
 lieth and all my lands that lyeth betwixt Mr John Marshall's and the Cark with that goeth from
 John Champs alias Coloneil Bacons plantation to wads the church. I say give the said lands
 to my sonne Thomas Pitt when he shall come to the age of twenty one yeare for and during his natur-
 al life and after his decease to the heire of his body lawfully begotten for ever and for want of such
 heires then to my sonne Henry Pitt for and during his naturall life and after his decease to the
 heires of his body lawfully begotten for ever and for want of such heires then to be equally divided and
 rest my five daughters and their heires for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my sonne Henry Pitt all that plantation where John Pitt now lieth
 that I bought of Mr Henry Blundis being about 260 acres, also to my plantation at the brooke where
 Benjamin Pitt now lieth which I bought of Christopher Holliman being about 150 acres as
 also 400 acres of land lying at the white den branch which I bought of Mr Thomas Culm for
 all that tract of land or plantation I give and bequeath unto my sonne Henry Pitt when
 he shall come to the age of twenty one yeare for and during his naturall life and after his decease
 to the heires of his body lawfully begotten for ever and for want of such heires then to the said
 plantations or tracts of land I give amongst my five daughters that is to say Martha Mary Elizabeth
 Anne & patinet Pitt for and during their naturall lives and after their decease to my sonne Dow
 Pitt and the heires of his body lawfully begotten for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my five daughters that is to say Martha Mary Elizabeth Anne & patinet
 Pitt to each and every one of them five thousand pounds of good tobacco and cash to be paid out of the
 annuall profits of all my lands proportionably when they or either of them shall come to the age of twenty
 one yeare or else marie anything in this will contained to the contrary notwithstanding and it

284 & children of my said daughter should by all God's gifts before their Cometh to the age of twenty one years or married then her part to be divided amongst my surviving daughters Item I make my dear and loving wife Mary Pitt my whole and sole Executrix and my Will is that all my children in my Country and be brought up with her till they come to the age of twenty one years or else in the plantation now live on and if it happen that my loving wife Pitt Predeceas'd by as God for his before my children comes to the age of twenty one years or married that never the less although I have given the plantation now live on to my son Thomas Pitt after his mother's death yet my will is that all my children may Continue and live on the plantation until they come to the age of twenty one years or else marry and that they shall go to school to write and read any thing in this will be contrary notwithstanding the same as witness for my hand and seal the 21st of April 1687 = Thos. Pitt Hals.
