The Humble request of Mary West

Humbly desireth that these Cattle here interited may be recorded for my Children:

To my eldest Sonne William West I give unto him one black p'd Cow halfe pint milk as followeth this is Cropt on each East & a halfe Moore one the upper side of each East & a milk Cow on each East with all her female increase

To my second Sonne Henry West I give unto him one branded p'd Cow he is about two yeards old of the same make the other is only a hole in the right East with her female Increase

To my daughter Mary West I give unto her one black soft heifer about two yeards old and one white soft Cow Calf with all their female increase they are marked as the first only a slit in the right yeard

Dated May the first 1682

Mary West

ordred by the Court held the first of May

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Cooke aged about sixty yeares or there about being in perfect memory prayeth to God for the good ordainment this to be my last Will and Testament in maner and forme as followeth: first I do bequeath my soule to God who gave it me: and next my Body to the earth to be buried in such maner as my loving wife thinks fitt and convenient and for my worldly good I do make my loving wife Christian Cooke the whole and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament only I do give the residue of the five hundred acres of land: wherupon I now dwell unto my Grand Child pool: Hawle: to her and his heirs for ever after the decease of his Grand mother Christian Cooke and what ever lyes upon the sayd plantation is not to spoile West nor Timber: upon the 3^d plantation but what is for the good of the plantation: and as for the hundred acres of land wherupon John Hawle lyes I do give it to my Grand Child John Hawle: to her and his heirs for ever also I do give my Grand Child Pool: Hawle: one mare three yeards old: and the bartage: with a flaxen mare and tayle: Cropt and slit in the right yeare: and swallow foote in the left and the sayd Pool: Hawle: do have her increase: and what increase she brings and nett to keep above what she or fowes: and what Increase more: to be turned into what his parents thinks best of for his use: also I give to his Grand mother for takinge a Course for his schooling: for it is my Will that he should live with his Grand mother so long as she liveth after I give to pool: Hawle one musket to be ready first for his use and my sword and belt also I do give to my

that this was present when Thomas ... Cause & his Will to be made: and when he went to sign
it and seal it: this the respondent held the Will in her hands: he putting his hands to it: his hands
did shake: and he sayd: ha. its not as it should be: but its well enough: and he did direct & comma-
nding of the Will: which is the Will now presented to the Court

The disposition of Susanna Callaway aged to yeares or there about being sworn and examined
sayeth the same with Mary ... and further sayeth that this the respondent did watch one
night with Thomas ... in the time of his sickness: and he did desire me to speak to John:
Forsell to bringe the Will which he the sayd ... did make: three or four yeares past: for
in that Will he gave his daughter's share all things: which he had already delivered to her: for
John Forsell brought up the Will and the ... took it in and made an other that night
which is the same Will now presented to the Court

The last Will and Testament of William Yarrell the grace of God that hath appeared
to all men hath been made manifest in me and it hath taught me to deny that
ungodly nature which is of the first Adam which liues in the worldly lust for the
saying: is faithfull and worthy all expectation that Christ is come into the world to
save sinners of whom I was one the ... but through his misery making his spirit
manifest in me to destroy the works of the devil and to bringe saluation to my house
for it is the heavenly talent that the Lord hath given me to make my calling: and
my election sure and this I do referre backe to him that gave it me and in it with it
I haue gained a title which he hath exempted of it as for my outward body which is of the
earth that must returne to the earth as for my worldly goods as followeth

I give unto my Grandchild Henry Stiggs the Younger of Rownt main
I do give all my movable goods and Cattel and all other Creatures in or about my plan-
tation that is mynt to be equally divided betwixt my two daughters: Elizabeth Murrey
and Margarett Yarrell

I give unto my daughter Elizabeth and her heyres for ever a small tract of Land
that doth by Robert two swamps at my miles end Joyninge upon John Murreys Land
I do give unto my daughter Margarett Yarrell my Plantation that I now live in with
all the houseting that are upon it with Orchards and all things ther unto belonging
and all the remainder of my Land that doth lie upon the front and adjoininge upon
William Briffis Land but if my daughter Margarett should decease without issue then
my Land to be given to my daughter Elizabeth Murrey and her heyres and for the true
performance of this my last Will & Testament I do bequeit and appoint my lovinge friend
Thomas Cook and Francis Rime to be my Executors or our selves to see this my last Will
