The last Will and Testament of James Macdonell being sick and weak in body but of perfect memory: first he bequeath my soul to God whose grace I receive and my body to the earth: in hope of a joyfull resurrection through the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ and as for my worldly goods I give as followeth:

I give and bequeath to my daughter Olive Macdonell: one hundred and two Cowe Cattle, some of which are of two years' old, that come of the said Cowe promise, and some sheeling Cattle: with some female mares.

Further it is my Will that one share about three years' old, which are now at George Newworthy's may be sold for Debts: and disburse for the schooling of my daughter.

I give unto my said daughter my Black walnut Chest and my Bible.

And as for the remainder of my Estate I give and bequeath unto my Wife Mary Macdonell and so to her and my Wife's Executors to this my Will, Witnessing at Collyer with witness Newworthy to assist her: in witness whereof I have signed my hand the 27th day of June 1686

Item I do give and bequeath the one half of my lands which I now enjoy and possess unto Thomas Powell: Nathaniel Powell: William Powell and John Powell to be equally divided amongst them after my decease and I do by this presents oblige them and their heirs that they shall not make sale of any part or partill of the said lands to any person whatsoever unless it be from the one to the other
