I Thomas Womble being in my perfect strength and memory do make this my last Will and Testament  
as for my personal estate what late land, hatch land, plate land & other property I have dispos'd of as followeth  
Item for you and your wife and my sonne Thomas that hundred and fifty acres of land contayning the now land  
and hundred and two acres to him and his heires of him and his heirs for ever

John Doe and his wife wrote my son John that he had sold a tract of land at further End of Pleasant and two hundred acres and two hundred and a young man of a giant built to him and the survivors of him & his heirs for ever  
John Doe and his wife sold me my daughter's one hundred and forty-four hundred and four & six hundred acres and two hundred and a tract of eight gallons on sugar leather chain on brick walls  
belonging to her and her survivors

Item Due you unto my daughter Margaret one feather Bed Dugg<sup>t</sup> boulders and thetis and four new wicks  
sicks and two Quirts and a large Kettle of eight Gallons and a raft and distreble to her and the survivors  
and a sufficient feather Bed.

John & Agnes and Agnes all sent my loveing. After I recd the remans of my personal effects and so much  
of my whole suit John recd me to have it at his disposal.

It is further more my will that my son Thomas while he is at the age of twenty years old shall have the  
library to stand upon his lands likewise that my son John shall have the library to stand at the same age & he  
have the benefit of his own labor; and the rest of his estate here before mentioned to them to enjoy  
and my two daughters, Joyce and Margaret to have & inherit equally at their day of marriage; and to have my two sons  
brought up to be as well wrought as his daughters to receive; and I do appoint my two living friends —  
Thomas Collier and John Murray as my executors to see this my last Will and Testament performed as well  
as I may leave it and let all this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of March 1887.

This is to give sufficient notice to the Justices of the Peace of Wright County that I am sent for by Thomas Newbold to make his Will & shall be left of my understanding written & dictated by him in the substance of it and am a witness to it and if in his Case or any other Person or Persons Called before this Court to declare the truth of what he said or declaiming contrary to the same to the best of my knowledge & judgment I do advise law made against me which persons may be Detained & upon me to witness my Parch.

John Shafford of the County of Ulster being in Health of body and of  
good memory, who, notwithstanding such infirmity of body doth appoint and make this to be  
my last will and Testament in manner and form as follows, to wit, without any of his Courts office outward and how  
to have my goods to settle and dispose of any of my effects. Except as in prouince of Ulster with exception  
of what may be required for debts of the same.

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Alice Stephen all my Estate personal and real by her Land  
during her自然年 Hoods and if she die in her自然年 Hood: that then my Son William Stephen and my Son  
the younger Stephen: to have each of them one third of the Estate: Item and if my said Son John Marry: that  
then all the Estate be equally divided Each of them to have a third: and that my executrix of this my Will  
to see after the said Estates parts and to Secure it, and improve it: as fully shall the said Stephen and his Country  
live that is least Expensiv: to enjoy it then thence: Item if either of the said Children do die before the age of twenty  
years: then the Estate to be divided between the other two: and if both die before the age of twenty one year:

one year that this little child so many tooth-ache's: and of such sort as to give me great trouble all year; that this year and especially two of the kinds of the effects that was the child owing to my brother Edward Holloway and his children, and the other kind you will be grateful to my Cousin Fortune Maggat. Item If God my Lord will let me have your son William baptised come to the age of eight years, or hundred days.
