I Thomas Wombell being in my perfect Senses and Memory do make this my last Will and testament as for my personal estate what I do leave hath bin & is as follows to witte
Item I doe give and bequeath unto my Sonne Thomas three hundred and fifty acres of land with all the houses and buildings thereunto appertaining to him and the heirs of him and his heirs for ever
Item I doe give and bequeath unto my Sonne John three hundred & 40 acres of land at further End of Patient and two hundred acres and two Courts and a younger Mann of a giant with to him and the heirs of him & his heirs for ever
Item I doe give and bequeath unto my daughter Joyce one feather bed & a bolster and sheets and four or five hundred acres and two Courts and a brasse kettle of eight Gallons one rusia leather chain on brasse Caudle
Item I doe give unto my daughter Margaret one feather bed & a bolster and sheets and four or five hundred acres and two Courts and a brasse kettle of eight Gallons and a brasse Caudle with to her and the heirs of her
Item I doe give unto my daughter Elizabeth the remainder of my personal estate and do make her my whole and sole executrix to have it at her disposing
It is further more my Will that my Sonne Thomas when he is at the age of threentie yeares old shall have the liberty to take uppon his lands liberties that my Sonne John shall have the liberty to take at the same age & have the benefit of their own labor and the rest of their estates less before mentioned to be to my joy and my two daughters Joyce and Margaret to have their portions at the day of marriage and to have my two sons brought up to be read and to write and the daughters to be read and I doe appoint my two loving friends Thomas Calver and John Murray as my overseers to see this my last Will and testament performed as will visit my lands and to alter this 30th day of March 1687

This is in quiet satisfaction to the justice of the field of Wright County that being sent for by Thomas Mowbray to make his will, he be left of my right and mine, and it is directed by him in the substance of it and as a will left to it, and if on this case or any other I may or shall be called before this Court to defend the truth I shall be found to have no contrary to the truth to the substance of my affidavit, and have inquired if I desire if law made against perjury persons may be returned upon me without my fault.

I John Shepherd of the upper parish of the Isle of Wight County being in health of body and of good memory knowing the uncertainty of death and the uncertainty of life do appoint and order this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form: following: without any of the Courts of the Court and law to have any power to add to or dispose of any of my effects: Except it be in proving the said Will. Signed in presence of three witnesses for the said John Shepherd

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Elizabeth all my Estate personal and real by Right and
during the Widowhood and if she die in her Widowhood: that then my son William the eldest and my son
the second Christopher to have each of them one third of the Estate: Item and if my said wife or Mary that
then all the Estate be equally divided each of them to have a third: and that in pursuance of this my Will
to be after the said parts and to trust it, with improvement as they shall think fittest until they come to
time that is then to enjoy it in full: Item if either of the said children die before the age of twenty
one years that then the other child to enjoy both parts: and if both die before the age of twenty one years
that then I give and bequeath two of the thirds of the Estate that was the childrens to my brother Edward
Holloway and his children and the other third I give and bequeath to my loving son Thomas Maggitt
Item If I die my wife die before my son William the eldest come to the age of eighteen or nineteen years
