In the Name of God Amen the 5th Day of the Month of October In the Year of
our Lord God 1677 We Thomas Woodward being of whole mind and in good
perfect remembrance Laud and praise be unto Almighty God, make and declare
this my present Testament Containing herein my last Will in Writings and for me follow
That is to say first I Command my Soul unto Almighty God my Maker & Redeemer
and my body to be buried, Item I will, that my wife have her full Child of my personall
Estate to her proper Use, and I ordaine my loving Children Phillaritie and Thomas my
whole Executors, And unto them I do bequeath the half of my Estate Equally to be
divided between them, I do bequeath unto my Daughter Phillaritie of this place, station
where I now do live and all the Land and Chattels unto belonging I do likewise give unto my
Son Thomas all my lands at the Blackwater or Elsewhere, and if it fortune that my
Son die without Issue then his Land to descend to his Sister Phillaritie, I do give the Rest
of my Estate to the Rest of the Children, Katharine and Elizabeth, Mary, John, & Ra-
bille Equally to be divided among them only a Parcel of Land At Ajuing upon John
Fulghams I do give unto my Daughter Katharine, and if my Son John Woodward
have left any Children in England I do give them the same piece of Land in con-
firmation whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seale the Day and Year above written

vantage of my said Sons or the Survivor of them, always reserving a compe-
tent number for breed and use, when in indulgent Care with Sam. I will be always
watchfull and industrious for our Childrens good and welfare.

I have given to Mary Knight my God Daughter One Cow Calf and his increase
 I have given the whole remainder of my Small but competent Estate to my
 Dear and Loving wife Jane, who with Doubt not improve the Same for the good
 of our Children, and make my said wife full and sole Executrix of this my
 Last Will and Testament In Confirmation whereof I have hereunto put my
 hand & Seal this the Christmase in the year of our Lord 1677
