

Wheras Robert Brook havinge Marry'd with Susanna the Relict of Edward Coddett and the
late George Benninge inconsiderately sayd Edward doth bind himself by the Content of his new wife to give
unto Thomas the sonne and heire of the said Edward one Cow and halfe wher the sayd heire shall
arrive to age and to pay all just debts due out of the estate

Wheras Francis Cosy did by her last Will bequeath the one halfe of her estate to Capt Thomas Grouse
for the bringinge up of her child John Cosy; and therayle Capt Grouse havinge made an agreement
with Mr Robert Blake for the bringinge up of the child, for the which Mr Grouse was to pay unto
Mr Robert Blake five pounds ten shillings a year and to finde him Cloathinge; wherupon Mr Thomas
Grouse haue failed in payment thereof beinge two years payment due. Wherfore it is ordered that
Mr John Williams and Mr William Green who are Securables for Capt Grouse performance thereof
they pay unto Mr Robert Blake 236^l of tobacco and Cash to this present tyme; and likewise
the sayd securities Mr John Williams and Mr William Green do pay unto Mr James Powell 72^l^r^t
of tobacco and Cash & bringe for Cloathinge for the sayd John Cosy

It is ordered that the estate of Mrs Dorothy Bondes be divided according to her Will's testament
by Mr Owen Griffen & John Portis and Mr Nicholas Cobb or any two of them at the house of Wm Bond
the 9th day of this instant

It is ordered that Mr James Powell doth let to farme the lands and entiments belonginge to
the orchards of Richard Briggs deo & until the orchards come to age; and to retaine the rents thareof
yearly and to be accountable for that part belonginge to that orchard at 10^l Pounds in recompence

In the name of God Amen I William Lewis beinge of perfecte mind and memory doe somwhat write in
Body present & therefore quen to almighty God do make and ordaine this my last Will and Testament
in manner and forme followinge first and principally I command my soule into the handes of almighty
God nowe through the merites Death and passion of my Savour Jesus Christ to have full and free
ardon and forquindess of all my sins and to intitule Euclaff my self and my Body I Comitt to the care
to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and as touchinge the disposition
of all such temporall goods what soe it shall please God almighty to offeres agyn me ffor me and my
herte of folowith

I give & bequeath that my debts and funerall charges shall be paid and discharged

I give and bequeath unto my eldest daughter Mary one hundred acres of Land midway from the River into
the woods to be paid and delivred her one day of marriage with out controulle
I give and bequeath unto my second daughter Sarah one hundred acres of Land midway
betweene the woods the said to be delivred unto her upon day of marriage

I give and bequeath unto my louing wife Martha Lewis one hundred and fiftie acres of Land during her
natural life, mounding the house and cleare ground there aboutes agyn and after her decease
be equally diuided betwene my two daughters Mary and Sarah

I give and bequeath unto each of my daughters three Cows and Calves to be payed them on day of marriage

I give and bequeath unto each of my daughters five swallows daffes and a good Chift when they shall attain
unto the age of fiftene yeres

I give unto each of my daughters a good feather Bed with what furniture thereto appertaineth

I do give all the rest and residue of my personall estate goods and Chatells what soeuer I do give
and bequeath unto my louing wife

And I do appoint the said Thomas my full and sole Executor in behalf of this my last Will
different and I do also appoint the said Robert Thomas and Mr William Evans Servants to my children
and I direct that my body may be buried by father in my orchard and that Henry should disown and
make good all former wills by me made and acknowledge this to be my last Will and Testament as follows
