

I Edward Miller, do hereby Acknowledge to have given unto Nicholas Chiller, my eldest son; & to the heirs lawfully to be: procreate of his body, with fulling; to returne to Edward Miller my youngest sonne and his heirs, with all fulling; to returne to the heirs of the donee vizt Two Cowes & one heifer of two years old, beinge all marked, wth a swallo: tails, on the left eare, & two halfe moons under the right eare, wth all their mowse, meale & fowle, as witness my hand, this 19<sup>th</sup> day of february 1671

I Edward Miller, do Acknowledge to give, unto my wife's Daughter, Mary Carpenter, one brown heifer beinge three years old or thereabouts, marked wth a swallon tails on the left eare, & one fitt on the top of the left eare, & three fitts, underneath the right eare, wth all the fowle mowse, as witness my hand this Nineteenth of february 1671

These two gifts above written, was Acknowledged by me Edward Miller in open Court to be his will & free Act & deed, & signed it might be recorded for their use

In the name of God Amen; William Morris, sith & dwelt in body but of good sound & spirit memory do make, & declare this my last will & Testament, in manner & form as followeth /

I give, & bequeath my soul, to God my maker; & my body to the earth wherof it is made to be decently Interred, and for my soul's sake, I have & leave God, to reward me wth in this world, I give & dispose of as followeth /  
 To my sonne William Morris, I give one hundred acres of my land, all about water, that I bought of Christopher Holliman & his wife & they shall have the hundred acres next; adjoining upon the said Christopher Holliman his land I likewise give unto him two acres, one called Lark, & the other called Neger, wth their jurats for ever to him his heirs & assigns forever, I give one hundred acres of land, adjoining upon my sonne John Morris, I give the next hundred acres of land, adjoining upon my sonne William Morris, I give one hundred acres, & three mowse, & to him I likewise give my great garden  
 To my sonne William Morris, I give one hundred acres of land, the last of my three hundred, bought of Christopher Holliman as aforesaid, wth the said land, I give to them & their heirs for ever, but if within shewth day, wthout estate or lease, or term, to the day, of one & twentieth year, I do desire, as it is my will, that his or their parts, shall fall and returne to the survivors; & his heirs for ever, To my sonne William Gasse give one acre, called Nans, & his mowse, & one two years old heifer, called prima, wth one cow, in which was a halfe moon under each eare, & a hob in the left and a male goods on the right eare, & the heifer of the same mts. but wth I give to her & her heirs wth their mowse for ever, at the day of marriage, I give unto her one small Iron pot, & my dale & forme, And a habitation or bringe upon this land, I have laid on till the death of my lawfull wife Elizabeth, & after her death, to be possit. wth the which hundred acres, shall fall to the survivors of my other children  
 To my Daughter Elizabeth Morris, I give one cow, called Bette, & one two years old heifer, called prima, wth one cow, in which was a halfe moon under each eare, & a hob in the left and a male goods on the right eare, & the heifer of the same mts. but wth I give to her & her heirs wth their mowse for ever, at the day of marriage, I give unto her one small Iron pot, & my dale & forme, And a habitation or bringe upon this land, I have laid on till the death of my lawfull wife Elizabeth, & after her death, to be possit. wth the which hundred acres, shall fall to the survivors of my other children  
 I give all the remaining parts of my estate, my dale, bringe, pad, wth wath & yonell, & do make, her fully & wholly, executrix of this my last will & Testament, to wth I have, putt my hand & seal, the day & year first above written  
 William Morris / signed
