These two gifts above written, was acknowledged by me Edward Miller in open Court to be his will & free don't & deed, & I desired it might be recorded for this use

In the name of God Amen; William Morris, Jurat & Vicar in body but of good sound & spirit memory do: make, & declare this my last will & Testament in manner & form: as followeth

I give, I bequeath my soule, to God my maker; & my body to the earth wherof it is made to be: directly Interred, and so buried after, I have & leave God, to dispose me wth in this world, I give & dispose of as followeth  
To my sonne William Morris, I give one hundred shrods of my land, all Blackwater that I bought of Christopher Holliman & his wife & my wife shall have the hundred shrods next; & my sonne upon the said 100: Holliman his land I likewise give unto him two groves, one called Lute, & the other called Nogar, wth their jurage for ever to him & his heirs one grove next  
To my sonne John Morris, I give the next hundred shrods of land, & my sonne upon my sonne Peter, & one shrods called Maiden wth a rowe raffe, & three mowage, & to him I likewise give my great grove  
To my sonne William Morris, I give one hundred shrods of land, the last of my three hundred, bought of Christopher Holliman as aforesaid, wth all the said land, I give to them & their heirs for ever but if either should dye, wthout wife or child, or come to the age, of one & twenty years, I do desire, & it is my will, that his or their wife, shall fall and continue to the survivors; & his heirs for ever, To my sonne William Morris I give one shrods called Nanno, & his wife, wth three mowage for ever, & my little grove  
To my Daughter Elizabeth Morris, I give one: Cowe called Lute one two years old heifer, called prime of wth Cowe: is marked wth a halfe Moone under each eare, & a hob in the left and a pale goods on the right eare, & the heifer of the same mke. but wth I give to her, & her heirs wth their mowage for ever all the day of marriage, I give unto her one: small Iron post, & my dale & forme, And a habitation or bingie: upon this part of land, I have laid on all the date, of my housewifery Elizabeth, & all her dale, to be: possit. wth the wth hundred shrods, to her & her heirs for ever, And if my Daughter should dye, unmarried, or without issue, then this land that I give her, shall fall to the survivors of my other children  
To my housewifery Elizabeth I give, & I bequeath, my dale, bingie: pad, wth wthall & ysmall, & do: make, her fully & wholly, & give all the wth mowage, wth of my estate, my dale, bingie: pad, wth wthall & ysmall, & do: make, her fully & wholly, & give of this my last will & Testament: to wth I have, putt my hand & seal, the day & year, first above written
