Item. That Henry Riggs the younger his grand child should have the Roane tract and a butif
bay mare fully free brought that is with her with the whole furniture to him and his heirs
Item. That 20£ should give to William Richards the sonne of John Richards as a legacy given
by my deceased brother to him two cows with their furniture.

Item. That my Brother John Murray's stocke of Cattle should at all times have the preuisage
of harts and deers to the said land and meadows for pasture that was my brothers without
any lett hindrance or molestation of me or any other person in Williams of the bush being
