In the Name of God Amen I Ann Day of the County
of Wigt of Wigt w^{ch} being sick and weak in body but praised be God of
sound and perfect sense and memory and calling to mind the certainty
of death and the uncertainty when or how soon it will befall me
now and do in this my sound and perfect sense and memory make
my last will and Testament hereby giving bequeathing and disposing of
my worldly Estate in manner and form following that is say.

- Item I Give and bequeath unto my Brother Joseph Allen my wedding Ring.
Item I Give and bequeath unto my Brother Arthur Allen and Sister Elizabeth
Allen Twenty shillings to each to buy Rings.
Item I Give unto my Sister Mary Bridger my negro woman named Begg &
if she dy before married then I Give the said negro woman unto
my Sister James Bridger and his heirs for ever.
Item I Give and bequeath unto my Sister James Bridger my negro man
called Dick and if he dy unmarried or before the age of sixteen
years attained to, then I Give y^e said negro to my Sister Mary Bridger & her heirs
Item I Give unto my Sister Elizabeth Allen my green silk suit of clothes and
head clothed therunto belonging.
Item I Give unto Ann Burnett my white suit of clothes & head clothed therunto
belonging.
Item I Give unto Mary Bridger my mare and saddle.
Item I Give unto my Brother Arthur Allen my Damask Table cloth and
two Damask napkins.
Item I Give unto Katharine Allen six silver spoons.
Item I Give unto James Allen two silver salts and salt spoons.
Item I Give unto my Sister Elizabeth Bridger my q^u new silver Tankard.
Item I Give unto my Sister Bridger my enamel ring.
Item I Give unto Mary Bridger my small ring.
Item I Give unto my Brother James Bridger my Diamond ring that was Mr. Pinner's.
Item I Give unto Helina Worsen my striped Persian cloth lined wth Persian

with head cloth, two good shafts, two aprons two handkerchiefs my striped
quilted petticoat and one bow and gale.

I give unto my brother John Allen Twenty shillings for aring.

In the gift of my clothed and habo things I give unto my sister Bridget.

I give unto John Worsen Hunt a bow and gale and a bow of Lamb.

After my debts legacies and funeral charges are paid I give and bequeath
all the rest and residue of my Estate of what nature or quality soever to be
equally divided and shared amongst my Brothers Arthur Allen, Joseph Allen
and Elizabeth Bridget and I do hereby appoint my Brothers Arthur & Joseph
Allen Executors of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have
put my hand and seal this second day of December 1726 Ann Day Seal
and so also in the presence of Roger Jolly, John F. Hunt, Moring F. Thomas.

Somerville of the County of Wiglit County in Virginia being in perfect mind and in
memory thanks be to God for it therefore calling to mind the mortality of
my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men Once to dye do make and
ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all
I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it and my body
I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion
of my Exors nothing doubting but at the General resurrection I shall receive
the same again by the mighty Power of God and as touching such worldly
estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give dispose
and dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

I give to Rebecca my dearly beloved wife my disposable the remainder.

I give and bequeath to my well beloved son John Somerville a Tract of fifty acres of land
and I give him two hundred acres of Land with the plantation where he
doth now dwell to him and his heirs for ever.

I give to my son Hodges Somerville all my Carpenters & Cooper's Tools & things he now possesseth

I give to my son James after his mother's decease the plantation where he now dwelleth
and all the Land that belongs to it to him and his heirs for ever and if he died
without heirs it must return to his Brothers John Somerville & John Somerville
