My I give to my son Elizabeth Scott my new silver tumbler.

My I give to my friend James Turner the sum of eight pounds in money.

My I give for all the rest of my estate when my just debts are paid to the within
1000 without give to be equally divided between my son George Norworthy
and my daughter Christian Norworthy and it is my will & desire that
my brother in law William Scott have the care of their estate & bring
them up and giving them what schooling he shall see fit but in case they
shall be the day in their minority when then it is my desire and I give it
that I give to them to be divided to be equally divided between my brother
in law William Scott the children of William Owland and also to make
and ordain my brother in law William Scott my only executor
of this my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & seal this 16th Nov: 1737. Christian Norworthy
and sealed & owned to be her will in the presence of us Edward
George Lawrence.
