I leave to my loving wife Sarah Hodges one negro boy named Tom during her natural life after her death I give the said negro boy Tom to my daughter

to Sarah Davis and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body for ever.
I give to my young sister Mary Hodges one negro woman named Linda and

all her interests to her and her husband lawfully separation of her body from ever.
I leave to my loving wife Sarah Hodge one acre of land named Dick Land.

the said negro man named Dick to her and her heirs lawfully begotten
of her body for ever but if dying without heirs I give the said negro man
to my Daughter Sarah Davis and her heirs lawfully begotten of her
body for ever.

both socks and tray.

am now to my said daughter Mary Hodges my 69th 600 and furniture.

Soz; now powder his legs & half a dozen plates & two saucers and two tankards.

and two trust parcels and mortall of all and I now lies upon to my Daughter
Mary Hoogles and her heirs of her body lawfully begotten for ever.

I leave all the remainder & part of my Estate to be equally divided betwween my wife & her children.
