I desire that Edward Wood should be sole free & to be at his own disposal to act & do as he shall see fit & be at liberty from all persons whatever.

I give and bequeath all his land which I am now possessed unto the twenty two acres more or less to be equally divided betwixt Thomas Mordland and John Goodrich my sons in law to them and their heirs for ever.

I give and bequeath unto them all the rest of my estate & personalty to be equally divided betwixt them both paying first my debts and then my legacies further I do make and ordain them both my executors and to be trustees of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and year above written being sealed published pronounced and declared by the said George Goodrich as his last will and Testament in the presence of us.
