three pewter dishes her choice, three new pewter plates, one large pewter
tankard, one pewter cup, one Iron pott, one Heather bed and furniture, her
choice, and then my debts and sundry charges first paid I do desire that
all the rest of my whole Estate both within doors and without may be
equally divided betwixt my loving wife and my four children William, a
Robert, Thomas, and Mary but in case she should be with Child before the date
of this my will I desire it should have as good apart of my Estate as any
of the rest and further I desire my wife may give my children one year-
schooling apiece or allow them twenty shilling & 10 pence out of the Estate
more than her part and I do desire my loving wife to be my sole Executrix
of this my last will wholly renouncing all former wills that shall be produced
so early 1648 and herein this to be my last will and Testament as witnesseth
hereunto I have set my hand and signed my seal this 19th day of April in the
year of our Lord 1727.
