and all the Land that belongs to it to him and his heirs for ever and if he died
without heirs it must return to his Brothers John Somerville & John Somerville

By Name to him and his heirs for ever. Likewise I give to my
son James one feather bed and two blankets one rug and one pair
of three pointer shoes and three pointer shoes Likewise I give to
my daughter Sarah one iron pot and one pot hook three pointer shoes
and two pairs Likewise I make Rebecca my wife sole executrix of this
my last will and testament by her freely possessed and enjoyed as
witness my hand and seal.
